

From the Master Association

The Master Board met on Sept. 11 and determined the following:

Executive Session:

- August executive session minutes were approved.
- Delinquencies/collections were discussed; management to look into a new collection agency.
- Approved the formation of a golf course committee to advise on the disposition of the golf course. Real estate sales agent has contacted the board as to the purchase of the golf course and properties.
- The formation of a house committee was discussed. This committee to be responsible for advising on the remodeling of interiors of the Delta and Vista buildings. It was decided to approach the adult committee to see if they are willing to form such a committee to take on the responsibilities.
- Approved the formation of an emergency power committee to look into the feasibility of installing a power generator at the Delta and Vista clubs to be able to operate the lights and air conditioning in the event of a total power outage.
- Discussed a draft of the waste water treatment plant acquisition. Swale is not to be included in any acquisition. Management to look into a phase one environmental report or an all-amenities inquiry report.
- Authorized management to negotiate an agreement to bring the Cyber Café in-house. An independent contractor would supervise the operations of the cafe and all service staff would be hourly employees.
- Reviewed draft CC&R Rewrite Committee Charter.

General Master Board Meeting - Warren Oglove, Vice President, Presided and reported:

- A Meet the Candidates meeting on Oct. 1 at 7 p.m. in the Diablo Ballroom to meet the candidates for mayor. A general discussion will take place as moderated by Peg Richards.
- The county plans on having two or three voting precincts at Trilogy for the Nov. 6 election. Pay particular attention to your precinct number when receiving your voting information as you will need it when you go to the proper polling place.
- The amenities committee reported that they had met with Jason Enos, the general manager of Trilogy Shea Homes. A general overview of amenities in place and those we may wish to add was discussed. It was pointed out to him that the master board had sent him a letter early last year regarding the importance of another clubhouse and pool which are high on the agenda. The anticipated location would be Marks Road. It will eventually be extended to Church Road. The next meeting is in November.

Action - August financial reports were presented and approved.

- Approved the minutes of the August master board meeting.
- Approved mulch/soil expenses of \$7,400 from reserves to operations and expenditure of remaining \$20,000 from reserves.
- · Approved insurance renewals of \$35,942.
- Openings were announced for all the newly formed committees (golf course; emergency power) and interested persons are urged to go to the HOA office to complete an application.
- Approved CC&R rewrite committee charter; we are still looking for members for the CC&R Rewrite Committee.
- Approved the use of the tennis courts by students of Rio Vista High under the direction of Michael Bouyer as long as he meets the board requirements of insurance - Trilogy being held harmless.

The next Master Board meeting is in the evening of Oct. 9 at 7 p.m.


Meet Your Mayoral Candidates

Everyone can participate! This year we added an optional opportunity for sellers to have their street highlighted on the community map to help buyers find the sellers! Sellers may phone Member Services (4200) **through September 28** to list their address for their "block" to be highlighted. The map will be emailed to residents by Oct. 5, and made available at the Welcome Center Gate the day of the sale to buyers visiting Trilogy. - 2. Tie an inflated balloon to your mailbox or tree.
- 3. Open your garage door.

When you finish selling, remove the balloon and close your garage door. The sale is open to the public, advertised in the local papers and flyers distributed. Outside buyers will not be allowed through the gates until 9 a.m., and residents are asked to postpone their shopping until 9 a.m. in consideration of sellers setting up for the sale. The semiannual garage sales have become enormously popular with almost half the residents either buying or selling. Some villages also use the event for fundraising. 

There is no such thing as an outdoor domestic cat in Trilogy. If you own a cat, it must be an indoor cat. If you want it to get its daily vitamin D, put it on a tether in your own yard.

The raccoon population has grown. The cat food that is outside is likely attracting more and more raccoons. If you don't like being kept awake all night by thundering hooves on your roof or patio cover (no, it is not Santa and his reindeer delivering presents...that comes in December), be sure to cut back all tree branches near any part of your roofline. That is how they get onto the patio covers and roofs. They just go up the tree trunk and branches and drop onto the roofs.

Weeds on adjacent property owned by the golf course or Shea became another topic that we discussed. Since we don't always know who to call, we were asked to call the HOA office at (4843) and they will determine what direction to take the complaint.

We got a preview of what is coming up at the October Master Board meeting on Oct. 9 at 2 p.m. in the Diablo Ballroom. The board will discuss allocating funds to build

a bathroom at the Cypress Bocce Courts, cars and golf carts not obeying stop signs, which again is raising the issue of allowing police to ticket violators if they are on patrol in Trilogy (which is a regular occurrence) and see the violation, and curb cutting to meet ADA approval in various locations around Summerset, just to name a few topics.

Bocce Club



Genealogy Club

Our genealogy meetings are always of great interest for those who have a curiosity about ancestors and their life experiences and struggles. Recently, we came across an article that dispelled a long held belief. How many times have we heard "our family's surname was changed at Ellis Island." In reality, the passenger lists were created by the ship's captain or designated representative before the ship departed from its port of origin. Since immigrants would not be accepted into Ellis Island without proper documentation, the shipping companies were very careful to check the immigrant's paperwork (usually completed by a local clerk in the immigrant's homeland) and ensure its accuracy to avoid having to return the immigrant back home at the shipping company's expense. Ellis Island inspectors operated under rules that did not allow them to change

the identifying information for any immigrant unless it was requested by the immigrant or it was proven that the original information was in error. Inspectors were usually foreign-born immigrants and spoke several languages, so communication problems were nearly non-existent. Many immigrants voluntarily changed their names, especially upon naturalization, in an attempt to fit better into American culture. Countless immigrants had their names changed by school teachers or clerks who couldn't spell or pronounce the original surname. Keep in mind that if your family underwent a name change in America, you can be pretty certain that it was at the request of your ancestor, or perhaps because of inability to write or their unfamiliarity with the English language. The name change most likely did not take place at Ellis Island.






