

President's Report March 8, 2016

On February 9, the Annual Meeting of the Trilogy at Rio Vista Master Association was held. Don Love and Teresa Fraser were elected to the Master Board by the vote of the Delegates. Congratulations Don and Teresa! I would like to thank the previous Delegates and Noel O'Brien a Director on the Master Board for their service to the community and welcome the 2016/17 Delegates and Alternate Delegates. It has become very clear that the Delegates are an important part of our community. Along with the Master Board, the Delegates represent you. Get to know your Delegate and provide input on what you want for the future of your community.

Executive Session:

- Since the acceptance of the LLD property, management has been working to have equipment moved that has been stored on the Liberty property by Coughran Mechanical Services. After several requests, and no response the Board has requested a letter to be sent by legal counsel.
- Amenities Committee discussion of current Amenities Committee and updating the Charter. A draft charter will be reviewed at next month's meeting.
- Formation of Contracts:
 - Wireless Master Relay Agreement reviewed the proposed contract with changes
 - 2016 Roadwork contract with AEC to provide plans, specifications and bid documents
 - Management Services review of the Action Property Management contract for renewal and consideration of performing a RFP prior to the next renewal.
- MTL: Director Kohn gave a report on the changes to MTL and the progress on developing a RFP for a new website


Bocce

If you happen to have New England roots on any branch, you will enjoy the vast data base of New England research resources on the society website. If you have no New England roots, you can still access data bases of old newspapers and historical publications from all over the United States, 3) State Genealogical/ Historical Societies; if researching a family in, for example Missouri, these state sites can be very helpful with brick walls. They can open doors and give clues to records that may be hidden otherwise, such as marriage, land, and mortality schedules.

Table Tennis

Table Tennis games begin with the serve, considered to be the most important stroke of each rally. A good serve is difficult for the receiver to defend or attack, ensuring the return of an easy ball for the server to go on offense and deliver a good third shot in an attempt to win the point. The second stroke of every game is the return of serve. Not surprisingly, this is the second most important stroke of each rally. A successful return could nullify the server advantage and give the momentum to the receiver. Subsequent to serving and a successful return, the play enters a sequence of stroke and counterstroke, until one player delivers a winning stroke that yields an error by the opponent. The game resumes with the next serve.

There are numerous types of serves a player can use to challenge the opponent: back-spin, top-spin, side-spin, short, long, fast, slow, and many combinations of these features. An effective way to practice serving is to play solo at one end of the table with a basket of balls, and to repetitively serve a particular stroke one wishes to learn and master. Many thousands of service strokes are required to learn and master a particular type of serve. Excelling requires strong will and perseverance!


