The Trilogy Rio Vista Master Association Board of Directors meeting was held in the Diablo Ballroom of the Vista Club on Tuesday, Nov.13, 2012.

Guest Speaker Chief Tom Myers from the Rio Vista Fire Department gave an informative report on the status of the Paramedics/EMT; Rio Vista fire staff; Medic Reserve; Montezuma fire staff; grant from FEMA; mutual aid from River Delta and Isleton; OSHA-4 on scene and in home smoke alarms. Chief Myers gave his thanks on the importance of passing Prop O.

Prior to the evening board meeting, the Executive Session convened. Actions taken:

- Executive Session Minutes for Sept. 11, 2012 and Oct. 9, 2012 were unanimously approved without correction. There was a review of in-house payment plans; Trustee Service foreclosures and lien reviews were discussed. A \$5,000 settlement offer was accepted (\$5,300 delinquency).
- A Nomination for Golf Course Purchase Feasibility Committee was made.
- Discussion Regarding renewal of Legal Services Plan.
- Review and discussion on Proposals for Collection/Trustee Services.
- Update on Nail vs. TRVMA

Actions taken by the Board at the November Regular Meeting included:

- There was unanimous acceptance of the CFO Budget/Financial Report for October 2012.
- Regular Board Meeting Minutes of Sept. 11, 2012 and Oct. 9 received unanimous approval.
- Consent Calendar Items:
 - Regular Board Meeting Minutes of Sept.11, 2012 and Oct. 9, 2012 were unanimously approved.
 - Expenditures (Ratifications)
 - ✧ Reserves – Vista Club Handicap Door \$3,049 (unbudgeted)
 - ✧ Operations – Leaf Vacuum - \$1,535.44 (\$1,350 budgeted)
 - ✧ Trustee Service (ATC) Payment \$2,011.55; Partial Payment of a \$4,823.03 Invoice
 - Salvage Declaration - \$1,000 (ten computers per Policy)

Unfinished Business:

- Wildlife Pest Management Discussion and Direction Regarding Animal Control. Motion passed (4 ayes; 1 abstention) for an expenditure of \$875 to trap animal pests for two nights at/around common area lakes, authorize dispatch as law permits, and award the work to Unique Pest Control.

New Business:

- Chris Sabye was unanimously appointed to the Golf Course Purchase Feasibility Committee.
- A unanimous motion passed for a Legal Services Plan with Berding and Weil in the amount of \$1,200.
- A motion passed unanimously for termination of the contract with Anguis and Terry Collections and enter into an agreement with Allied Trustee Services (ATS) under its "no cost, no fees" program.

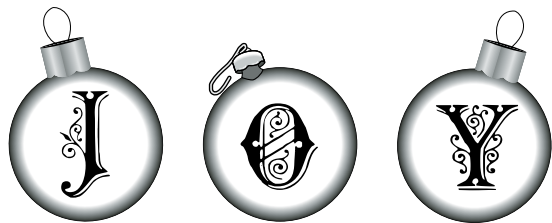

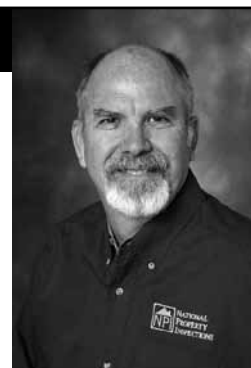

As we look at the long lines of people trying to buy food, water, and gasoline, we are reminded of disaster preparedness. We all laugh when people ask, "How can you live in California with earthquakes?" Since the ones we actually feel are so few and far between, we scoff. But, scoff as we might, we must be prepared. Trilogy has a disaster preparedness committee, with written procedures to follow in case of an emergency, whether from an earthquake or a hazardous chemical spill outside our gates on Highway 12. You may pick up this concise booklet at the HOA Office if you do not already have one. Be prepared and know what to do and where to go.

Is your driveway stained from your golf cart or car? We are allowed to stain our driveway, but only with a limited number of colors. Shea will demonstrate some of those colors in the model home area, so if you want to see what the colors look like, check with the sales office to see when this will be done.

The Fish and Game Department has explained how we might rid ourselves of the turkeys. A depredation permit must be issued. If you have had issues with the turkeys on your property, contact the HOA Office. Your input is invaluable.

Reminder: feeding wild animals, other than birds on feeders, is against the CC&Rs.

- * Document your research finds. Be prepared for anything.
- * Keep calm and cite your sources.
- * Dissect your relatives' obituaries. Check for key clues such as parents' names, places of birth, surviving kin, places of burial. Birth and death records have a wealth of information.
- * Only a small percentage of all historical records are available through websites. Nevertheless, explore the websites for the state archives where your ancestors lived. These repositories often have state censuses, newspapers, old vital records, records of state institutions, and more.
- * Take advantage of National Archives - they're great sources of federal records and historical information. Both the U.S. National Archives and Records Administration and the Library and Archives Canada have a wealth of information and even free databases you can search.
- * If all else fails, take a trip and visit the court houses in your ancestors' home state.
