The Golf Course Lakes

As many of you have noted, the lakes/ponds on the golf course are emitting foul odors. Unfortunately, the HOA has no control over the golf course. If you wish to take action, call the Yolo-Solano County Air Quality Control Board at (800) 287-3650. This agency has jurisdiction over the lakes. Most important, you must specify the exact lake and location (e.g. the 12th fairway).

The front gate computers have been operational for the past month. To alert the gate of visitors, simply visit residentguest.com, sign in, and register your guest.

Executive Committee Meeting

Tom Moore, our V.P., has turned in his resignation. We are now accepting applications for the remaining 15 months of his term. Please get them at the HOA Office and turn them in by Sept. 30, 2013. We will hold interviews are on Wed. Oct. 2 at 9:30 a.m.

The Board has appointed the village delegates as members of the Document Rewrite Committee. The delegates will be appointed after the February 2014 elections. If a village delegate is also a Master Board member, the alternate village delegate will assume membership on the Rewrite Committee. This will ensure that every village is heard as we go through the rewrite.

The Board has made a written offer for the Waste Water Treatment Plant. We understand that the offer will be presented to City Council during their October closed session.

Master Board meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 10, 2013

The President's report addressed theft at Trilogy. Someone has stolen sprinkler heads from some of the parks, doggie bag rolls, rolls of toilet paper, over 50 DVDs and books from the Library, and utensils and porcelain coffee cups from the Vista Cafe. These items add up to thousands of dollars and are paid from our homeowner dues. If you suspect suspicious activity, call the HOA to report it.

The Board has approved the upholstery of chairs in the Sonoma Room and Billiards Room. The Board has approved a 275 word limit for articles submitted to *Trilogy Living* Magazine. This does not affect HOA or resident's/HOA village submissions.

The Board approved annual road work in Trilogy. Look for notices to see if your area will be affected. The work should be done during late September/early October.

The map will be emailed to residents by Oct. 4, and made available to visiting buyers at the Welcome Center the day of the sale. Copies will also be available at the Vista Club Saturday only. You do not have to be included on the map to sell. There are three points all sellers need to do:

- Obtain a garage sale permit for \$1 at Trilogy Member Services prior to Friday Sept. 27. Permits are a city requirement. Good news, sellers can also purchase permits through Oct. 4, from Member Services at the Vista Club!
- 2. Tie an inflated balloon from your mailbox or tree.
- 3. Open your garage door.

When you finish selling, remove the balloon and close your garage door. The sale is open to the public, advertised in the local papers, and flyers are distributed. Outside buyers will not be allowed through the gates until 9 a.m., and residents are asked to postpone their shopping until that time in consideration of sellers setting up for the sale. The semi-annual garage sales have become enormously popular with almost half the residents either buying or selling. Some villages also use the event for fundraising. 





The Saddle Rock Village Board of Directors met August 21. President Patty Kohn announced the resignation of Stephanie Lanning from the Architectural Committee and requested that interested residents complete an application.

The importance of voting on the proposed purchase of the golf course and Nines Restaurant was reviewed. Board member Joel Auslen explained the voting process. Marlene Percivalle and Richard Larsen were selected to serve as election inspectors with our Delegate, Roger Kohn, serving as chief inspector.

Evelyn Jarland reported on the Architectural Committee. Since the first meeting in June, 67 requests have been reviewed. However, only seven completion notices have been submitted. Residents are reminded that upon completion of work, a project completion form must be submitted to the HOA office. Regular meetings of the committee are held the first and third Monday of the month at 11 a.m. in the River Room, Delta Club. Residents are welcome to attend.

Several residents raised concerns that 14 trees had been cut down along Summerset Drive between Diamond Hills and Rutland. The homes on Birch Ridge, which back up to this area, were directly affected. At a meeting held Aug. 27 Jason Hughes, Shea Homes, and Ed Vitrano, General Manager, provided information regarding problems that led to the decision to remove the trees. Mike Oestreich, Maintenance Supervisor, showed residents the trees and shrubs that are planned to replace the former plantings. Residents requested that they be given the opportunity to select among three choices of shade tree. The request is being considered.

Village Riviera Board News

We had a great turnout at the September meeting, with hot topics ranging from feral cats to golf course Inspector of Elections to neighbor notification of pending work and possible health issue in lakes.

The most vociferous group was in regards to those being affected by feral cats, now roaming, howling, mating and digging up yards in the Brockton/Western Hills area of Riviera and the Deerfield area of Village One. If you are feeding feral cats, please stop immediately. If you know of someone who is feeding them, please report it to the Homeowners Association Office. No action can be taken by the board unless complaints are filed. You must be specific as to the address of the person feeding the cats and must sign the complaint. As of this writing, 60 cats have been trapped in the Oakridge area. Please also remember that your domestic cat is not allowed out unless leashed. It is against the CC&R's, but it could also be victimized by a feral cat or raccoon.

Dante Miles is Inspector of Elections for the golf course purchase vote. Dante will assemble a team to assist in the counting of the Riviera ballots, and once counted, he will take the actual count of yes and no votes to the Master Board. Your ballot will have a pro and a con argument as well as rebuttals

to each. Each residence will have one ballot. There will be a 30-day period to return the ballots.

Solano/Yolo County Air Control Board has been advised of the condition of the golf course lakes as a possible health issue. If you wish to call them regarding this issue, in hopes of forcing action, their number is (800) 287-3650. This does not just involve people living on the golf course by a lake, but everyone in the community.

Neighbor notification of pending work was discussed briefly, but no vote was taken. This will be on the November agenda. Our next meeting is Nov. 7 at 6:30 p.m. at the Delta Club. For more information, Call Don at (6407).


Bocce Club

Nature Club



insects flying high and low as we walk about our community. Is it a dragonfly or a damselfly? How can we tell the difference? Hints for a quick identification:

We have all seen these interesting

Size/Body: the dragonfly is usually much larger (one to four inches in length) and stockier in build than

Dragonfly

the more slender damselfly (one to two inches). Both have minute antennae.

Wings/Resting Position: at rest, dragonflies hold their wings outstretched horizontally while the damselfly's hinged wings are held closed and above the body. In addition, the two sets of the damselfly wings are usually about the same size whereas the two pair of wings of the dragonfly are of unequal size.

Eyes: cold weather curtails hunting activity in dragonflies whereas the less temperature sensitive damselfly can occasionally be seen hunting during cold spells. The broadly rounded dragonfly eyes lie mostly flat against the head and touch or almost touch one another. The damselfly eyes are separated, mostly spherical and protrude from the sides of the head.

Hunting Habits: both the damselfly and dragonfly capture their prey in their hind legs located on the thorax near the head. They have a set of prehensile "lips" located underneath their head. These can be extended forward much faster than most prey can react making their bite fatal. Favorite delicacies of both insects are mosqui-

toes, hoppers, flies, gnats and other small insects. Dragonflies also consume mayflies, bees, wasps, butterflies and smaller dragonflies. Some dragonflies are known to pluck spiders from their webs and eat them.



A dragonfly can consume its own weight in insects in approximately 30 minutes.

Damselflies tend to be much less sensitive to pollution than are dragonflies. Dragonflies with their stronger wing muscles can travel long distances and may migrate to other loca-

tions. Some local names for dragonflies from around the country are hawker, darter, chaser, and skimmer. Damselflies are also known as the Demoiselle.

To get a nice brown crust when searing meat, do the following: Heat a heavy skillet or Dutch oven over low heat for a few minutes before adding fat. Meanwhile, pat the meat dry with paper towels,



then season with salt and pepper. (Don't season too far ahead—salt draws out moisture.) Turn up the heat and add a thin coat of oil to the pan. Place the meat in the pan one piece at a time, leaving space around each piece. (If there's not enough room, sear in batches.) Resist the urge to turn the meat until it releases easily from the pan.




