Future Amenities: On 08/30/16, a Joint meeting of the Master Board and all the 6 Village Boards was held to review and distribute a legal opinion on future amenities. Legal counsel attended to respond to additional questions. The meeting was open to members.

Administration Office Renovation (Delta): After a thorough investigation of the proposal submitted by the Long Range Amenities Committee, it was determined that its vision could not be realized utilizing the proposed solution of renovating the existing space. The team submitted additional suggestions on how to move forward with providing a safe and pleasant work environment for staff.

Streetlight Lighting Audit: As the Board continues to consider changing the existing Street lighting from high-pressure sodium to a more energy efficient lighting, members met with Dr. Papmichael, Professor in the Department of Design and Co-Director of the California Lighting Technology Center, at the University of California, Davis. A report was given on benefits, recommendations and considerations. Currently, there are sample LED of various lumens on Vintage from Cypress to Colonial. Palisades Gate: On 08/06/16, someone ran through the exit gate. Expected to be fixed by the end of the month. Fortunately, the responsible party reported the accident and the Association will receive the reimbursement funds from the homeowner's insurance.

Unfinished Business:

 Amenities Committee: a new charter and appointments were approved. The Board wants to express a thank you to all of the members who submitted an application. We received 14 applications, and were only able to select seven. The following members were appointed: Barb Downs, Joe Downes, Rayno Niemi, Warren Oglove, Don Seyk, Gary Swieso and Lynn Traver.

New Business:

- Operations Surplus: The surplus from Operations 2015/16 of \$337,580 was allocated in the following manner: Rolled Over to 2016/17 for those capital improvements, which were budgeted, \$174,074.82 Reserve Funds and \$43,518.70 to future member assessments.
- Dog Park: Members presented concerns regarding the Shea proposed Dog Park. Those concerns consist of: location, maintenance and enforcement. The responsibility of maintenance will be the Association's after it has been constructed per the local/state mandated requirements. The Dog Club also spoke in support of the location, and requested the Board to ensure





Trilogy Access Committee

Each month the committee meets to investigate issues brought to it by residents. For years the committee has heard the concerns from residents regarding unknown people using resident entrances for access to the



community. The committee also heard the concerns regarding guest delays at the Welcome Center.

It is clear from a Town Hall meeting, electronic survey, concerns expressed at meetings, and on social media these problems are an ongoing concern. The committee membership has changed but throughout it all two things are clear; the concerns still exist, and access issues will continue until build-out of the community is complete. The committee has investigated solutions and made recommendations to address parts of the problem but action has been delayed.

The committee decided to take a holistic approach and consider the problems as part of a single system that will exist once the community build-out is complete. The major recommendations are the same as recommended in the past, Barrier Arm Gates, RFid tags, and QR readers; but now this hardware and software will work together as part of a system including policies and procedures For the first time, the Master Board has recently sent a Request for Proposal (RFP) to vendors as the next step in answering the concerns. Stay tuned and stay involved.

the Dog Park is visualized. The Board approved (4, 1 abstention) to support the Dog Park in the proposed location. I abstained from voting, as the property is currently not owned, operated or maintained by the Association. Until the property has been transferred to the Association as Common Area, the Board has no control of the proposed improvement.

- Bocce Complex Benches: The Bocce Club requested to purchase nine additional benches for the Summerset Bocce Complex. Approved \$9,000: The Association will purchase and be reimbursed by the Bocce Club.
- Tennis Court Rehabilitation: In determining the precise needs for maintenance of Courts 1 & 2, a contract was awarded to Associated Engineering Consulting to test existing construction of the courts and soil, review and prepare bid documents based on what is found and solicit bids.
- Stop Sign Installation on Westbound Silver Ridge Drive: Access Committee submitted a request to install a stop sign at this location due to resident concerns. Tabled: due to additional information needed, including a review by a traffic engineer.
- Delta Club Window Replacements: In the process of removing the blinds in preparation of installing new blinds, it was found that windows on the west

- and south side of the Delta Club are damaged and need to be replaced. Approved \$6500 from Reserves, award contract to California Glass. The windows will be replaced, and the delay of the installation of blinds will be Oct/Nov.
- Document Distribution to Members | Opt-In Campaign: Members are encouraged to Opt-In (meaning: receive all Association official documents by email). In order to Opt-In, you must authorize the Administrative Staff in writing. Forms are available at all meetings. A campaign to notify and encourage members to select this method is happening as this is being written.
- Amenity Town Hall/Vision Meetings: Town Hall meetings are a method for the full Board to gather and discuss items that concern the community. It was approved meetings will be held, it is anticipated the Amenities Committee will be involved. Suggestion was made that the Amenities Committee to survey the community for ideas of future amenities, also those they currently use or participate.
