



An Executive Session of the Board of Directors was held on Monday, March 11.

- At this meeting we received an update from our attorney on the transfer of the Lighting and Landscape District.
- The HOA and the city are in the final stages of the contract for the HOA to take over the LLD. The city is looking for a final decision of acceptance from us by April 1. We also received an update on the status of the agreement for the Waste Water Treatment Plant negotiations. Initially the transfer of the two projects was to happen simultaneously; however, it is quite likely that the WWTP will be subjected to a delay until we complete our due diligence.
- We have entered into a contract with AEI Consultants out of Walnut Creek to conduct a Phase 1 ESA study of the WWTP. Their technician has visited the site for the inspection and AEI will file their report with us, which we expect to receive toward the end of the month. One advantage of a successful report is that we will not be responsible for any prior activity if we are able to obtain a successful Phase 1 ESA report.

A Master Board meeting was held on Monday, March 11.

- General Manager Ed Vitrano gave an update on the process and standing of the negotiations of the two projects. We will hold a special board meeting the last week in March with (time yet to be determined) for final approval of the LLD.
- The Town Hall scheduled for March 17 will be postponed and conducted prior to the special board meeting (date yet to be determined). We will email an e-alert announcing the date of the two meetings.

The next Master Board Meeting is on April 8 at 2 p.m. in the Diablo Ballroom at the Vista Club.



Saddle Rock Village Board News

Saddle Rock Village has enjoyed tremendous growth over the past year. The influx of new residents is energizing and has caused us to rethink many of our guidelines and processes, including driveway parking, architectural guidelines, and the composition of our village board.

The first big change: Saddle Rock Village has new driveway parking regulations. Residents may now park one approved vehicle in the driveway at any time. Residents voted in favor of this change by more than two to one in our annual election. It was passed by the board at our February meeting. Residents must obtain a parking permit, available at the Association Office, for each vehicle that they may want to park in the driveway.

The second big change, revisions to our architectural guidelines, may take some time to reach resolution, but we are off to a good start. At our February 19 meeting, we held the first reading of the revised guidelines. These suggested changes were also included in the March issue of *Trilogy Living*. Residents are encouraged to review the proposed changes and provide feedback in writing. Please submit suggestions at the Association Office.



Finally, the Master Association Board, which appoints the members of the village board, has decided to increase the size of the board from three members to five. We have an abundance of talent among our residents, and serving on the board is an excellent way to channel all that creativity. Residents are encouraged to apply by completing a candidate statement available as an insert in the March *Trilogy Living* magazine and also available at the Administrative Office.

Saddle Rock Village Architectural Guidelines

Proposed Changes

At the February meeting, the Saddle Rock Village Association (SRVA) Board of Directors approved a First Reading of additions/changes/amendments to the Saddle Rock Village Association Architectural Guidelines. Following is the rationale behind the suggested changes. Comments, in writing, can be delivered to the administrative office at the Delta Club, can be mailed to 990 Summerset Drive, Rio Vista, CA 94571, or emailed to evitrano@actionlife.com.

A Second Reading for final adoption will take place at the monthly board meeting on April 16, 2014. You are welcome to attend and make comments.

Committee Name – The Architectural Committee is the name of the body responsible for review of architectural standards, application forms, and completion notices.

Submittal Deadline – Previously applications could be submitted at the Architectural Committee meeting. We are now requiring that the form be submitted three working days prior to the Architectural Committee meeting to allow time for the Architectural Coordinator to review the materials and prepare them for the committee's review.

Neighbor Acknowledgment Forms – Previously, use of the form was limited to "Hardscape" improvements. The form should be used for all landscape changes.

Neighbor Acknowledgment Signatures:

- So that neighbors are aware of intended "hardscape" improvements, (see below), signatures are required prior to submittal of plans. A Member applicant may collect the signatures themselves or ask Management to collect them. Signatures do not indicate approval or denial of plans by the neighbor.
- If a neighbor has a concern, they must make their concern known in writing, or by personal appearance, to the Architectural Committee. An applicant will be notified if a concern has been submitted. The Architectural Committee will not deny plans based on neighbor objection alone.

"Hardscape" - Improvements of a permanent nature or vegetation 10' or taller

- i. Front/Side Yard Signatures of three neighbors across the street and those sharing side property lines.
- ii. Back Yard Signatures of neighbors sharing any portion of property lines.

40% Vegetation Requirement – To eliminate confusion, this requirement now applies to all landscape projects, not just those designated drought tolerant. Also, because some plants are so sparse or the maturity of the plant is so long, we are requiring that the 40% green rule apply within two years of planting.

Any plans for drought tolerant yards must have 40% of the areas covered with vegetation as it would appear at maturity or no later than two years from the date of planting.

Review by Architectural Committee – To avoid ambiguity, applications will be either approved or denied. There will be no "conditional approval."

The Architectural Committee may approve conditionally approve, or deny any application or return it for further



information.

Pre-Approved Improvements – This section of the handbook proved confusing to many residents, as it was unclear what was actually pre-approved. Unchanged are the lists of plants and the requirements related to those plants. Changes to this section include: pre-approved landscape elements apply to both the front and back yards; mowing strips and rock or gravel are included in the Pre-Approved section (see below), lattice work trash/air conditioner enclosures and sheds require submission of applications in all cases.

In order to ease the process, the Architectural Committee has pre-approved certain landscape elements, which may be installed in your front or back yard landscape areas without the formality of an Architectural request or approval.

- 1. Mowing strips and borders around planting areas and tree wells.
- 2. The addition of rock or gravel that is less than ¾ inch. It must be comparable and compatible to what is existing in the Community.

Other Improvements

The following pre-approved items do not require an application:

Lattice trash and/or air conditioner unit enclosures (Exhibit available in Association office.) Specifications and examples are available at the Association Office.

Items Requiring Approval

Trash Enclosure and Storage Sheds

Lattice trash and/or air conditioner unit enclosures Residents may install only a specific lattice product to enclose trash and/or air conditioner units. See (Exhibit available at the Association Office.) specifications and an example available at the Administrative Office and in Appendix A, Figure 1.

Storage Sheds:

 Vinyl-type storage sheds, (specifications for types and models are available at the HOA office).

An application must be completed showing type, material, and dimensions of the proposed storage shed as well as where the storage shed is being placed. A picture or drawing of the shed is especially useful.

•If the selected site has a direct view from your neighbor's window, You must obtain a A neighbor acknowledgement form must be included with an application to the Architectural Committee.

- Install shed per the manufacturer's instructions. Sheds must be installed per the manufacturer's instructions.
 - If the shed is to be installed on a concrete pad, a "Home Improvement Request Application" for include the details of the pad must be approved by the Architectural Committee include the details of the pad in the application.

Screen Walls and Wind Breaks – Clarification regarding when trellises are screen walls was added.

Trellises that are constructed of wood and lattice panels will be considered screen walls and must be five feet from property lines. Wood and lattice trellises may be placed against the walls of the house or garage unless they are permanent structures.

Trellises – The requirements related to trellises were not fully documented. Many residents are using these structures in various ways. The new trellis regulations are intended to ensure that structures do not obstruct neighbors' views and allow for maintenance on both sides of the trellis.

- 1. Trellises shall be no more than 12 feet in length and no more than six feet high.
- 2. If more than one trellis is being installed, allow at least four feet between trellises.
- 3. Trellises that are constructed of wood and lattice shall be considered privacy screens. As such, they must be five feet from side or rear property lines. Wood and lattice trellises may be placed against the walls of the house or garage unless they are permanent structures.
- 4. Trellises may be placed against the wall of the house or garage, provided they do not exceed the length and height restrictions.
- 5. Black or bronze steel powder coated trellises that have large openings throughout the structure (at least six square inches) may be placed two feet from the property line. This setback allows room to maintain the trellis even if a fence is on the property line.
- 6. Black or bronze steel powder coated trellises may be placed on the side of the house, at least six inches from the property line, but cannot extend beyond the front of the house.
- 7. Trellises constructed of material other than wood or steel will be considered on a case by case basis.

Fence Location – This section was rewritten to remove reference to premium lots, as residents with those lots often believed that they were entirely exempt from fence



rules. Also, to avoid confusion, we specified that you may attach to any fence as long as the fence adheres to the fence guidelines.

Fence location: Permitted in rear yard only and may not extend into the side yard area beyond the rear most edge of the house. except for premium lots. Exceptions regarding oversized lots will be considered on an individual case basis.

Neighbors have the right to attach to any fence installed on the common property line as long as the fence adheres to the fence guidelines as illustrated.





Tips on preparing your family for a natural disaster before it happens: prepare an emergency plan and regularly conduct drills; identify an emergency evacuation for your home and include an alternative way to escape in case the main entrances into rooms are blocked; establish a place where your family can reunite after an emergency; establish an alternative way to contact others who are not home, such as an out-of-the-area telephone contact, as completing local telephone calls during emergencies may be more difficult than contacting someone out of the area; maintain an emergency preparedness kit with enough supplies on hand to be self-sufficient for at least three days (preferably up to one week); and ensure to have a gallon of water per person per day. If you have battery-operated smoke-alarms, test them every month using the alarm test button. Keep fire extinguishers in high-risk areas such as in the kitchen and garage, and know how to use them.

Wildlife Management

Feral Pigeons

Most of our Trilogy pigeons can trace their ancestry to Europe and the Middle East. Apparently, they came over to North America as early as the Pilgrims and are now found everywhere. Pigeons don't migrate. Instead, they adapt to varied conditions, from cold Alaska to hot Arizona. Pigeons mate for life and produce a beguiling coo when perched on a drainpipe with their beloved. That said, pigeon droppings could be unsanitary. As with other wild creatures we have discussed, the best residential management lies in denying them access to food and shelter. Please be sure pigeons are not eating birdseed that has been put out for other birds.

Keeping Them off the House/Exclusion Methods

Chicken wire and/or netting can be placed under overhangs and into openings created by dwelling design. Bird spikes may also be used to exclude pigeons from narrow areas such as window frames. Bird spikes are narrow



twig shaped strips of clear plastic about six inches high that can be attached to the top of a window or door frame. Because they

are clear, they blend in with the color of the house. Bird spikes prevent pigeons from landing and gaining a foothold on the house without harming the bird. Chicken wire and bird spikes do work, but pigeons also try to roost on gutters, on roof tiles, and near solar panels. We have heard that pigeons don't like WD-40 sprayed on roof tiles, possibly because of the odor it creates or because it is slippery. We don't know for sure. If you try it with success, please let us know by filling out a communication form at the HOA office. Thank you for choosing humane methods of wildlife management. Sources: Blechman, Andrew D. 

Monthly Q and A: Do I need to refrigerate frosted cakes and cupcakes? The type of frosting you use makes all the difference. Cream cheese and whipped cream frostings contain a high percentage of perishable dairy and should be refrigerated within about two hours. Buttercream, ganache, and simple glazes can usually sit out at room temperature for a day or two, even if they contain a bit of milk or cream (sugar acts as a preservative when used in high concentrations). If you do refrigerate your treats, bring them to room temperature about an hour before serving.
