


#### President's Report July 12, 2016

The Board continues to have full agendas, as there are many projects that are either new or ongoing which need its attention. Some items were not addressed on Tuesday's Executive meeting due to lack of time. In order to allow additional time, future Executive Sessions will be scheduled for the Monday before the General Session.

**Future Amenities:** The Board continues to examine and research every document and avenue for verification and enforcement regarding developer-provided amenities.

**Additional Clubhouse:** A legal opinion was obtained regarding "the promised 60,000 sq ft of clubhouse space," as claimed by some. With any written opinion, additional questions need to be answered so the Board is scheduling a followup meeting with legal counsel. Information about the substance and requiring construction of the "60,000 sq ft of clubhouse space" will be available upon request, after the Board has completed a full evaluation and received all the information.

**Design Center:** The Amenities Committee presented to the Board the proposed use of the facility to be dedicated to "Health & Wellness". Health & Wellness focus would be to move the Cardio Equipment and Weights, Group Ex, Massage, Naturopath, Acupuncture and Staff to the Design Center. These moves would than present new opportunities in the Vista Club. After approving the proposed use of the Design Center, allows for the Board to move forward with determining cost estimates and funding.

**Dog Park:** Management presented a design concept on items to be considered in the layout and construction of the Dog Park. The funding allocated in last year's budget has been placed in a segregated fund.

**Access Improvement:** The Access Committee submitted a proposed RFP. The Board approved moving forward with the distribution of the RFP to company's experience with Community Associations. Additional member input will be gathered regarding the proposed changes: changing the swing gates to lift gates, changing from the transponders (clickers) to RFID sensors. No decision has been made at this time, only gathering information and costs.

**Administration Office Renovation (Delta):** The Board approved a budget of \$50,000 in the fiscal year 2016/17 to remodel the administration office. The Board approved moving forward into a planning phase to define the remodel requirements. Reporting on this item will be monthly.

**Reserve Expenditures:** Replacement of the Delta Club window coverings. The Board approved a bid from Delta Draperies to replace and install all the windows coverings in the Delta Club. Look forward to a new fresh look, the blinds will be off-white.


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

Don, Larry Mork, Village I President, and Richard Pettijohn, Olympic Village President, met with Jason Enos, Community Manager at Shea Homes along with Jason Hughes, Assistant Manager at Shea Homes, to discuss the building of a fourth club.

It was confirmed that Shea has a \$1,000,000 budget for a fourth club. The facility would take about seven months to complete and would start prior to completion of the final build-out. The amenity would be at the intersection of Marks Road and Valley Landing Lane with a parking lot adjacent to the well site. When asked about plans submitted to the city, Mr. Enos explained that they would be submitted to the City, however, the full construction and associated costs could be in the \$100,000 range and would not be prepared initially. He would provide an artist rendering for planning purposes, but until there is a written agreement between Shea and the Master Association, no funds would be committed.

Even though the Council of Village Presidents has no authority to negotiate common area issues, they feel that they have a responsibility to their village members to urge the Master Board to act in a timely manner in order to secure the fourth club.

### Genealogy

We can use almost any civilian or government program to assist us in finding our ancestors and the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) is one of those programs. It was formed to help address the severe unemployment that accompanied the Great Depression; Congress authorized the creation of the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1933. The Corps provided employment to unemployed, single men typically between the ages of 17 and 28. Most of its efforts focused on conservation projects such as building roads, planting trees, erosion control, and responding to floods, fires, and other natural disasters. By the time the program ended in 1942, the CCC had established work camps in every state, and more than 3 million men had passed through its ranks. The men were typically housed in barracks, fed three meals a day, given new clothes and paid \$30 per month. Since most were there to help their families, \$25 of their earnings was sent to the family and they would keep \$5. Shortly after the Corps' organization, the first issue of Happy Days, a privately owned paper that aimed at serving the CCC's new enrollees was developed. It was intended for the entertainment and information of the workers and included work project notes, accomplishments, firefighting reports, heroic deeds of enrollees, success stories of former enrollees and much more. Happy Days can be accessed through the National Archives and Records Administration, Washington, D.C., and online at Ancestry.com's database of Happy Days Newspaper of the Civilian Conservation Corps, 1933-1940.
