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

Executive Session took place prior to the Master Board meeting on Jan. 14, 2014:

The Master Board met in Executive Session on January 14, 2014. Derek Jones, the Chairman of the LLD/WWTP Committee met with us and gave details of the negotiations between the Committee and the City regarding the transfer of the Waste Water Treatment Plant to the HOA and our taking possession of the Lighting and Landscape District.

The board will provide by electronic mail on the Trilogy Living web site, prior to The Master Board's regularly scheduled meetings, Financial Statements, draft minutes of the last meetings and other pertinent information. This is scheduled to begin prior to our February 11th. Meeting.

The Board discussed problems some of the staff is having with one particular resident. The issues border on sexual harassment. A hearing on the matter is being scheduled.

Master Board Meeting took place on Jan. 14, 2014:

Derek Jones gave a report on the LLD/WWTP issue. The City wants to disband the Lighting and Landscape District. They are willing to give us the treatment plant at no cost if we take possession of the Lighting and Landscape District. The Committee feels there will be a cost savings to the homeowners. Residents pay approximately \$88 per year (shown on the tax bill) on property taxes. The assessment on the tax bill would cease and our dues would rise to cover the cost of operating the Lighting and Landscape District. It's estimated there will be a \$50,000 annual savings by taking it over. All information will be provided to residents as we move forward.

The Board adopted a Code of Conduct for The Master Board. At the February election for the Master Board, all Board Members will agree to abide by The Code.

The Board moved to pay \$16,567 out of our operating funds, instead of taking the money out of reserves.

Use of our facilities by Rite Aid Pharmacy to have a wellness clinic on Super Bowl Sunday was denied.

Delta Club renovations to the restrooms was approved. The estimated cost will be \$27,319.

The next Master Board Meeting will be on February 11, 2014 at 2 p.m.

January 2, 2014 came upon us quickly. Our Annual Board Meeting was conducted as the required quorums were met. We talked a lot about the GC, the WWTP, and the LLD. We were brought up to date by General Manager, Ed Vitrano, on all of these issues.

The Inspector of Elections, Myra Samfeld and her appointed assistants went off to count ballots under the watchful eye of Catherine Patrick. There was a total of 220 ballots submitted. Three positions were open on the Riviera Board. Those were filled by Carolyn Azbell, Marty Plavin, and Ron Waite. The excess funds proposition was passed, so any funds left at the end of our fiscal year will roll over to the following year. Ron Waite also self-nominated to be Riviera's Alternate Delegate. Finally, our Delegate race, which had had four contenders, was brought to a halt with a tie between Dante Miles and Barb Downs. A run-off election was held, with ballots due back by January 23, 6:30 p.m. By the time you read this article, the election will have taken place and the Delegate will be announced in the March *Trilogy Living*.

President Don Seyk reported on the President's Counsel meeting, an unofficial group of Board Presidents who meet on a regular basis. Their main recent concern was that Shea is building new things that have previously not been allowed per our CC&R's. Things like exterior color, lattice work and wood fences are three examples. Please be reminded that before any exterior work is begun, you must fill out an Architectural Review Committee ("ARC") application, which can be obtained from the HOA Office or in the hallway of the Delta Club.

The new Board elected their slate of officers amongst themselves. Don Seyk will remain President, Ida May Wagner will be Vice President, Marty Plavin will remain Treasurer, Carolyn Azbell will take over as Secretary, and Ron Waite will be a Director.







Reminder: Put a light on, check your yard, and even make a little noise before letting your pet out at night. Critters will leave your yard and leave your dog smelling sweet.


Bocce Club

Bird Watching Tips

Winter bird migration is in full wing. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife offers these tips:

- * Go early in the morning or near sundown, not midday when birds are less active.
- * Keep voices down, car doors quiet, and movement to a minimum.
- * Don't walk up to birds quickly or directly, as doing so will cause them to fly.
- * Be patient, giving birds time to show themselves.
- * If you don't see birds in the first location, move on.
- * Be careful parking on the sides of country roads.
- * Staying in your car with the windows down, engine and radio off, and quiet is often the best way to see and hear many birds. Your car does not look dangerous to them.

Monthly Tip: The shelf life for whole dried spices is two years; shelf life for ground spices and dried herbs is one year. Buy spices whole, versus ground, whenever possible and grind them just before using. Grinding releases the volatile compounds that give a spice its flavor and aroma. The longer the spice sits around, the more compounds disappear. Don't store spices and herbs on the counter near the stove. Heat, light, and moisture shorten their shelf life. To check for freshness, crumble a small amount of the dried herb between your fingers and take a whiff. If it releases a lively aroma, it's still good to go. If the aroma and color of a spice have faded, it's time to restock.

Changes to Olympic Village Architectural Guidelines

At their January meeting, the Olympic Village Association (OVA) Board of Directors approved a 1st Reading of additions/changes/amendments to the Olympic Village Association Architectural Guidelines.

Following is the rationale behind the suggested change. Comments, in writing, can be delivered to the Administrative office at the Delta Club, can be mailed to 990 Summerset Drive, Rio Vista, CA 94571, or emailed to evitrano@actionlife.com.

Submittal Deadline

In the past, plans were sometimes submitted at the committee meeting itself and were woefully inadequate. The suggested three days advance submittal allows time for staff to review plans, which sometimes requires additional documentation or neighborhood acknowledgement.

Landscape

While the Board supports the 40% rule regarding drought tolerant landscape, past experience has shown that some plantings are so sparse, or the maturity of the plant is so long, that the property looks stark for far too long. Two years seemed to be a reasonable time for plants to mature.

A 2nd Reading for final adoption will be on the March 13, 2014 agenda, which you are welcome to attend and make comment.

Suggested Changes – If applicable, deletions are denoted by strikeouts and additions by highlights.


