#### **Recipe Club Monthly Q&A:**

My cast-iron grill pan produces a lot of smoke. How can I prevent this?

Some smoke is inevitable. You need a screaming-hot pan to get nice grill marks, and hot cast iron tends to smoke. To keep smoking in check, be sure to use the right fat. Vegetable and canola oil can withstand high heat, whereas extra-virgin olive oil, butter, and margarine start smoking at lower temperatures. Also, consider rubbing the food with oil instead of adding oil to the pan. Remember to trim excess fat off your meat and let marinades drip off the food before grilling it. Finally, make sure the pan is clean. Scrub it with coarse salt and a damp soft sponge, then rinse off the salt and dry well.


## **Supper Club**


