

An Executive Session of the Board of Directors was held Monday, Jan. 20. The following action took place:

• Discussed the offer from the City pertaining to the transfer of the Waste Water Treatment Plant to the Association at no cost, if the Association agrees to take possession of and operation of the Lighting and Landscape District. The Board will meet with Trilogy's attorney at February's Executive Board Meeting for direction. The attorney will negotiate a transfer agreement directly with the City's Attorney.

A Special Board Meeting was held on Monday, February 6, regarding the 2014-2015 budget.

An Executive Session Meeting was held on Tuesday, February 11. The following actions took place:

- Marion Aaron, a Partner at Berding & Weil, discussed issues surrounding the WWTP/LLD. A preliminary preparation of an offer to transfer the properties is in its beginning stages.
- The Board agreed on a format for the oath all board members will be required to take when being seated at the first board meeting of the New Year, or when replacing a board member mid-term.

A Regular Board Meeting was held on Tuesday, February 11. The following actions took place:

- The 2014 2015 Budget was approved, with a slight decrease in the monthly assessment.
- Annual Passes were eliminated.
- The Board approved an expenditure of \$11,200 to remove palm trees from in front of the Delta and place them in locations where the palms are dead on Summerset Road near the Welcome Center and Clubhouse Drive. The LLD will pay for the replacements on Summerset Road.

The Annual Meeting of the Delegates was held on Tuesday, February 11. The following actions took place:

- Election of the Board for the two open positions on the Master Board was held. Don Love won one seat and Noel O'Brien was re-elected to the other seat.
- The Board elected Don Love President for the coming term. Warren Oglove wishes Don all the best in the coming year.

The next Board meeting is March 11 at 2 p.m. in the Diablo Ballroom.

Violations – Please do not register complaints to the Administrative Office/HOA without making sure you have the correct address of the person in violation. Example of what not to report – two houses down from the corner of a particular street.

If you receive a violation notice, please contact the HOA office.

Your Pets – Your Responsibility – Please show pride in your community by carrying bags with you when you walk your pets or by using the bags provided in dispenser throughout the community. Also, thank you for keeping your pets on a leash at all times.

Updating Your Information at the Administrative Office – It is important to let the Administrative Office know when any of your information changes including moving from one property to another within the community. (Please include address, phone, email, frequent guests, emergency contacts, etc.).

Late Charges on Assessments – If you are paying your assessments through your bank, it is recommended that you move the date of payment to the 1st of the month when the assessments are due. Many banks are batching payments before sending them out, so even though your



account may show a payment on a particular date, the payments are not being mailed on that date. If you schedule payments through your bank or mail your check after the 1st, you run the risk of being charged a late payment.

Parking in front of mailboxes – Thank you for helping our mail carrier deliver your mail, our staff deliver fliers and for giving your neighbors easy access to their mailboxes by not parking in front of mailboxes and asking your service providers to park elsewhere also.

Irrigation – Please adjust your sprinkler system to reflect weather conditions.

Welcome Center/Dwelling Live – Please make sure that your guests and vendors give your full name and/or address to give the Welcome Center attendants; otherwise they will not be given access. The Welcome Center attendants are grateful to those members who enter guests on Dwelling Live, call the Welcome Center or email them when you are expecting guests and especially when you are having a party and expecting several guests. They don't want to deny access to anyone you are expecting but have no choice if they haven't been notified and they can't reach you to get your authorization upon your guests' arrival. Instructions for using Dwelling Live are available at the Vista and Delta Clubs.

Suspicious Behavior – Trilogy is a private community but not a secured one. Please keep your doors and windows locked when away from home and lock your car. If you observe unusual behavior that warrants police notification, please make the call.

Dumping Trash – Thank you for using your own receptacles for disposing of trash rather than any others throughout the community, and for not putting soda cans, water bottles and other trash in the doggie waste disposal receptacles. All residents are required to have garbage service.

Service Provider Resource at the Delta Club – There are two business card holders on the hall wall at the Delta Club. When looking for service providers, check out this area. TRVMA/HOA does not recommend any of these vendors; this is simply a resource for members.

Pets in the Clubs – No pets are allowed in either the Delta or Vista Clubs with the exception of service dogs. Service dogs are allowed only if they have been registered with the Administrative Office and have a TRVMA identification card. They must have their vest and TRVMA card on them at all times when they are in the clubs and they must be accompanied by the person for whom they are providing a service. If you do not comply with a request from a staff member to show them the TRVMA card, you will be required to leave the club until you present it.

Therapy dogs are not allowed in the clubs at any time. They are not service dogs and are not protected under the ADA.

Gardeners – Please remind your gardeners that they cannot start work before 8 a.m. and that they should bag all clippings/leaves and not blow them into the street, gutters and others' yards.

Architectural Applications – Important reminder: Applications must be submitted for work being done on the exterior of your home and yard. If you do not submit an application, a \$500 application fee can be charged.

Riviera Board News

Congratulations to our new Riviera Delegate Barbara Downs. Although 290 votes were cast at the run-off election, Riviera will only have 220 to cast towards the candidates running for the Master Board. Only the official ballots at the January 2 annual village meeting are allowed. Next year help us get more of the 526 Riviera households voting.

Unless there is a special assessment, there are only two times each year that assessment can change, once at the beginning of the Master Association's fiscal year, which is April 1, the other is at the beginning of the Village Association's fiscal year, which is June 1, for Riviera. Near the end of March those who have not signed up for ACH (Automatic withdrawal) will receive a coupon book with two coupons, one for April and one for May. Then, near the end of May, they will receive a 10-coupon book for June 2014 through March 2015. If your payment is automatically pulled by Action, you will not receive any coupons.

Please read the notes from the administrative office usually found prior to the HOA and villages section. Some items you should look at are: updating your information at the Administrative Office if anything has changed, filling out Dwelling Live so your visitors will be allowed in, and setting up electronic communications with E-Alerts and Disclosure Opt-in to save our assessment dollars.





Wildlife Management Sub Committee

Swallows are returning to California, some from as far away as Argentina. Many of us love to see the graceful and iconic birds swooping and diving in flight as they catch mosquitoes, beetles, and flies. Here in the delta, we have the swallow essentials: (1) open space (2) vertical walls with overhangs (3) mud of the appropriate type, and (4) fresh water nearby.

Nesting period is February 15 - September 1. Swallows are protected migratory birds. During the nesting period, completed nests or partial nests with eggs cannot



be touched. Nests under construction, however, may be washed away with water or knocked down. Exclusion by mesh netting ½ to ¾ inch may also be used but only be-

fore the swallows return, not after they are already here. For many reasons, some of us may not want swallows to build their nests on our houses. If you do not want them to nest, at the first sight of mud pellets (nest building), quickly and persistently (everyday) remove the beginnings of the nest. Please enjoy the swallows from late winter to early fall knowing that you may use the simple and cost effective methods described above to keep the swallows away from your home if you choose not to allow them to nest.



ANIMAL CONTROL REGULATIONS FROM TRILOGY CCR'S

- Owners of any pet within the Community are required to control their pet in a manner which prevents the pet from creating a nuisance or making excessive noise and from assaulting other residents or other pets.
- 2. Owners of pets shall keep their animals under strict control at all times. When off the owner's premises, pets shall be kept on a leash.
- Pet owners shall immediately remove any waste created by their pet on their own property or other resident's property or on the Common Area (including streets).
- 4. Pet owners shall keep their animals off the property of other residents.
- 5. The owner of any pet creating a nuisance for other residents is subject to action by the Board of Directors, which may include, but is not limited to monetary penalties. In an appropriate circumstance, the

- Board of Directors may require the pet be removed from the development.
- 6. Excessive barking, howling, or other pet noise will be considered a nuisance and is not permitted.
- 7. Pets are to be licensed and immunized as required by City and County ordinances.
- 8. An owner may keep no more than two dogs, cats, or other customarily un-caged household pets within his/her Separate Interest.


