





President

An Executive Session of the Board of Directors took place July 8.

- Discussed the transfer status of the LLD from the city to Trilogy. We are still awaiting clarity on the same issues from the City and expect an answer soon. Once those issues are settled to our satisfaction we will proceed quickly to bring the WWTP/LLD transfer to a close. If we cannot settle the issues prior to late August or early September it is highly likely the transfer will not take place for another year as the City has to either transfer the property or start the process of collecting assessments for another tax year.
- A decision was made to add Master Board member Warren Oglove to the Saddle Rock Village board to replace Kathi Bradley, who resigned. Each village does not become autonomous until they reach a certain portion of build out. Patty Kohn remains President.
- Alan Levine, chairman of the Emergency Action Committee, met with the Board to discuss and review the role of the committee both from the standpoint of approved actions and limitations.

The regular Master Board meeting took place July 8.

- Rio Vista police chief, Greg Bowman, gave an update on emergency notification for those who do not have telephone land lines. For those who use cell phones as their primary phone or wish to be notified on their phone please contact the police department and request information of the Tip411 program. Presently, emergency notification is distributed by the reverse 911 system only, which is limited to land line phones.
- The Board accepted the annual audit conducted by Levy, Erlanger & Company.
- -The Board approved an updated Pavement Management Plan, which will review all of the roads within Trilogy to confirm or adapt the future schedule of road improvements. This review is routinely done every four years. The plan was approved for a not-to-exceed \$6,420 from the Board Operations Contingency.


Bocce Club

½ cup dried parsley

1 egg, beaten

Preheat oven to 300F. Put banana in a large bowl and use a spoon or potato masher to mash it thoroughly. Add oat flour, parsley, peanut butter and egg and stir well to combine. Set aside for 5 minutes. Roll mixture into 24 balls, using about 1 tablespoon dough for each, transfer to a large parchment paper-lined baking sheet. Use the

back of the spoon or the heel of your hand to press each ball into a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2-inch patty. Bake until firm and deep golden brown on the bottom, 40 to 45 minutes. Set aside to let cool completely. Storage: Store in either an airtight container in the refrigerator or freeze as needed.

Monthly tip: The sugar in corn starts to convert to starch as soon as the corn is picked. The longer the corn is off the stalk, the higher the starch concentration becomes. This reduction of sweetness is a telltale sign of old corn. When the corn is boiled, the high temperature will also cause the conversion rate to increase. Refrigeration slows it down somewhat. Also, never salt the water the corn is being cooked in since the minerals in salt will toughen the kernels. Salting after it is cooked does not have a negative effect. Yellow corn contains more vitamin A than white corn. When you purchase it, be sure that the silk is not brown.


