Executive Session: Approved minutes for the May 10th meeting.

Legal/Litigation: Our legal counsel attended to provide an update on the projects they are working on our behalf; pertaining to the Association's property ownership, the final draft of the CCR's and preparing for negotiations with Shea Homes for future amenities.

General Session:

Future Amenities: Legal Counsel will be working with the Board to provide input and direction for negotiating with Shea Homes. The Board will be working on a cost analysis for completing the Design Center and the 4th Clubhouse and projecting monthly expenses. Next month the Board will be reviewing proposed facility use and layouts for the Design Center.

Unfinished Business:

- House Renovation Committee: the revised charter was approved. The Board will be accepting applications until July
 If you are interested in participating on the committee contact the Administrative Office for an application.
- Reserve Expenditures: after reviewing the bids for replacing the Delta Club Window coverings and the Vista Club carpets for the Monterey, Sonoma and Learning Center the windows coverings bid was tabled and staff was directed to provide warranty information for all bids. The carpet replacement was awarded to Gillespie's Carpet \$11,693.
- Bocce Complex Completion & Acceptance: management performed a walk-through to accept the improvements at the Bocce Complex. Improvements totally \$127,886.00 was funded by: Reserves \$28,558.40, Operating funds budgeted 2015/16 \$29,000, Bocce Club \$15,000, Shea \$55,328.




- 1st Reading of the Amenities Committee Charter: a new committee, 'Master Amenities Committee" will be replacing the two existing amenities committees. (Amenities Committee aka: Shea Committee, and the Long-Range Amenities Committee). Once the new charter is approved the existing committees will be formally disbanded. The Board will be accepting applications, if you are interested in participating on the committee contact the Administrative Office for an application. If you have previously submitted an application it will still be considered as the Board did not appointment to either of the existing committees in March.
- 2016 Road Work: the Board awarded the contract for this year's roadwork to AMSI in the amount of \$293,113. The work is comprised of three parts: streets identified and scheduled per the Pavement Plan and Reserves, the intersection of Summerset Drive/Road to the Welcome Center (this is on the interior of the gates toward the golf course) and crackfill

on St. Andrews from Cypress to Summerset Drive north. Work is anticipated to be performed in August or September.





Eagle Point (None until dormancy ends) Association Minutes and Financial Statements - Minutes of the Master Board Meetings, Village Board Meetings, Committee Meetings, and Financial Statements, are posted on www.MyTrilogyLife.com (MTL) and www. vivoportal.com (VIVO) for your review.

Credit cards – Credit cards are accepted at the Café, and Member Services for events, fitness cards, personal training, spa services, etc. They are accepted at the Administrative Office/HOA for payment of transponders, keys and payment plans. They cannot be used to pay monthly assessments at the Administrative Office but you can pay monthly assessments on VIVO with credit cards.

Club hours - The Delta Club is open from 7 a.m. - 11 p.m. From 11 p.m. - 7 a.m., there is no entry. The Delta Club pool, spa and patio are open 24 hours daily. The Vista Club is open from 6 a.m. - 9 p.m.

Mail theft - Members are encouraged to put outgoing mail in the mail box in front of the Delta Club. Putting it in your mail box and raising the flag makes it very easy for thieves to know which mailboxes to target. When away for a couple of days or longer, be sure to put a stop on mail delivery with the post office. If you see unusual activity near mailboxes, call the Rio Vista Police Department immediately. If a vehicle is involved, try to get a license plate number. Once the individual(s) leave, there isn't much that can be done. Check with the post office regarding locking inserts that can be put inside your current mailbox. Try to be at home when having parcels delivered to your front door.

Parking in front of mailboxes – Thank you for helping our mail carrier deliver your mail, our staff deliver fliers, and your neighbors maintain easy access to their mailboxes by not parking in front of mailboxes and asking your service providers to park elsewhere also.

Street lights – Report all street lights that are out to the Administrative Office/HOA. Please have the light pole number, street name and the nearest cross street. Due to the high expense of hiring the boom truck, service is called once there are 10 lights needing repair. This could mean several weeks between the time you report the light and the actual repair.

RV/Boat Passes – Taking an RV to the Welcome Center each time you need a pass is unnecessary. If an RV has been registered on Dwelling Live, a resident can simply go to the gate and pick up the pass. You can now get a 24- or 48-hour pass for RVs/Boats. Be sure to let the Welcome Center attendant know which pass you need. Reminder: you may not have these vehicles in the community longer than 48 hours and they cannot be occupied while in the community. They are to be parked at your home, not in any other common or undeveloped areas of the community.

Electronic communication – The Association is no different than other organizations in leaning more on electronic communications to its members. There are two ways you can assist in reducing costs to the Master and Village Associations. Thank you for considering both of the following options.

e-Alerts – Submit your email address to the Member Services desk at the Vista Club. This will get you information such as special announcements, monthly agendas and most importantly, the weekly e-Newsletter, which updates you as to activities in Trilogy and the greater Rio Vista area.

Disclosure Opt-in – Required documents such as budgets and yearly financial statements can be delivered electronically by signing a form authorizing delivery by electronic methods, available at the Administrative Office.

We'll then work with the email team to make sure that you're on the 'active' list in the email system. It is also suggested that you add the e-Newsletter email address – noreply@actionlife.com - to your "safe senders" or "friends" list in your email settings to reduce the odds of problems.

- Submit residential ads for *Trilogy Living* Kathy Nilsson, Member Services, Vista Club (707-374-4200)

Indoor plants – Please do not use the potted plants as garbage receptacles and do not water plants. A contractor takes care of the plants and when well-meaning members decide to help, it often makes matters worse. The plants are expensive to replace and all members pay for replacements.

Anonymous communication – Only signed Communication Forms will be accepted and can be submitted to the Administrative Office.

Violations – Please do not register complaints to the Administrative Office/HOA without making sure you have the correct address of the alleged violator. Example of what not to report: two houses down from the corner of a particular street. If you receive a violation notice, please contact the HOA office.

Your pets – your responsibility – We appreciate everyone who is considerate of your neighbors and shows pride in your community by carrying bags with you when you walk your pets or by using the bags provided in dispensers throughout the community to pick up after your pets. Thank you for keeping your pets on a leash at all times.

Pets in the clubs – Pets are prohibited in both the Delta and Vista Clubs, with the exception of service dogs. Service dogs are allowed only if they have been registered with the Administrative Office and have a TRVMA identification

card. They must have their vest and TRVMA card on them at all times when they are in the clubs and they must be accompanied by the person for whom they are providing a service. If you do not comply with a request from a staff member to show them the TRVMA card, you will be required to leave the club until you present it. Therapy dogs are not allowed in the clubs at any time. They are not service dogs and are not protected under the ADA.

Updating information at the Administrative Office – It is important to let the Administrative Office know when any personal information changes including moving from one property to another within the community. Please include address, phone, email, frequent guests, emergency contacts, etc.

Late charges on assessments – Assessments are due on the first of each month. Many members treat the 15th as the due date and then request a waiver of the late fee when payment is not received by the 15th. If paying assessments through a bank or mailing a check, it is recommended that date of payment be moved to the 23rd of the month so that the payment is actually received by the first when the assessments are due. Many banks are batching payments before sending them out, so even though your account may show a payment on a particular date, the payments are not being mailed on that date. In addition, the post office has closed facilities and laid off employees. This is resulting in longer times for mail to reach its destination. If payments are scheduled through a bank or mail without adequate time allowed for delivery, there is a risk of being charged a late payment.

Welcome Center/Dwelling Live – Please make sure that your guests and vendors have your full name and/or address to give the Welcome Center attendants; otherwise they will not be given access. The Welcome Center attendants are grateful to those members who enter guests on Dwelling Live, call the Welcome Center or email them when expecting guests and especially when having a party and expecting several guests. They don't want to deny access to anyone you are expecting but have no choice if they haven't been notified and they can't reach you to get your authorization upon your guests' arrival. Instructions for using Dwelling Live are available at the Vista and Delta Clubs.

Irrigation – Please adjust your sprinkler system to reflect weather conditions and the Governor's Executive Order/City Ordinance to water only twice per week.

Suspicious behavior – Trilogy is a private community, but not a secured one. Please keep doors and windows locked when away from home, and lock your vehicles. If unusual behavior is observed, call the police.



HOA/notes from the administrative office + village news

Dumping trash – Thank you for using private receptacles for disposing of trash rather than any others throughout the community, and for not putting soda cans, water bottles and other trash in the doggie waste disposal receptacles. By city ordinance, all properties are required to have garbage service.

Service provider resource at the Delta Club – Service providers' business cards are displayed on the hall wall at the Delta Club. TRVMA does not endorse any of these vendors; this is simply a resource for members.

It's your money – Help to cut down on avoidable expenses.

- Thanks to all members who put down umbrellas at the bocce courts, the Delta back patio, and especially the Delta pool area when you are leaving and no one else is around. When the wind catches the umbrellas they are often damaged and must be replaced. If they are on the glass tables in the outdoor pool area, not only are they damaged but the glass table tops are shattered. This costs time of the maintenance staff who must ensure that all glass is cleaned up, and also the expense of replacing the table tops. The table tops and umbrellas are quite expensive. Again, thank you for saving all members the cost of replacing them.
- Please report any theft to the Administrative Office/ HOA. Remember that when something is stolen, all members pay for the replacement. The Association needs help from all residents in cutting down on theft.

Gardeners – Please remind gardeners that they cannot start work before 8 a.m. and that they should bag all clippings/leaves and not blow them into the street, gutters or others' yards.

Architectural applications – Applications must be submitted for work and improvements done to the exterior of your home and yard. If you do not submit an application, a \$500 late application fee can be charged.

Delta and Vista Pools – Guests must be accompanied by a resident. Children under the age of 18 are allowed in the pools from 11 a.m. - 3 p.m. and must exit the pool area by 3:15 p.m.

Golf carts/bicycles – Must be operated under the California Vehicle Code. Golf carts may not be driven by anyone under 18 years of age.

Clotheslines must be:

- 1. Manufactured specifically for that use;
- 2. Removable and no taller than 6' (six feet);
- Single-line that is retractable, and can be attached to patio cover supports;

- 4. Neutral in color;
- 5. Independent of any fence, tree, or any other part of a structure other than a patio cover support (i.e. gazebo, sheds, etc.)
- Limited to backyards and may not extend beyond the sides of the house;
- 7. Abide by established 5' (five foot) setback from back property line;
- 8. Used only during daylight hours and removed from view after use:
- Removed permanently if the apparatus falls into disrepair.



Bocce



Genealogy

The first railroad tracks were laid down in Quincy, Massachusetts in 1826. Since that time, there have been many different railroad companies. Some have disappeared, others have merged, and a handful still exist. They all produced personnel records that genealogists can use for research today. You just have to know where to look at the particular railroad company for which your ancestor worked. The railroad records can be anything from scanty to guite detailed in the information they provide. The place you should start looking is the U.S. Railroad Retirement Board. These records include anyone who worked for the railroad for a decade or more after the board was created in 1935. You can get detailed employment, personnel, and retirement records for your ancestor from this board. If you know the name of the railroad company for which they worked, you can go directly to that company if it still exists. You can find other records at railroad museums, local historical museums, local history archives, local libraries, university libraries, and even better yet, online. You will usually be directed to the website of the place that has the records, or at least to a website that lists their location. These are valuable resources for those with ancestors who worked for the railroad. Make sure you check them out.






