

Trilogy Community Garage Sale

Saturday, May 5, 9 a.m. - 3 p.m

Everyone can participate! This year we have added an optional opportunity for sellers to highlight their street on the community map. This will help buyers find the sellers! Sellers, simply phone Member Services (4200) prior to May 1 to give your address for your block to be highlighted. The map will be emailed to residents by May 4, and made available at the Welcome Center the day of the sale to buyers visiting Trilogy. Copies will also be available at the Vista Club Saturday only. You do not have to be included on the map to sell. Nothing else has changed. There are three points all sellers must adhere to:

- 1. Obtain a garage sale permit for \$1 from the City of Rio Vista downtown at City Hall prior to Friday, May 4. That is a city requirement. City Hall is closed all Fridays and weekends.
- 2. Tie an inflated balloon to your mailbox or tree.
- 3. Open your garage door.

When you finish selling, remove the balloon and close your garage door. The sale is open to the public, advertised in the local papers, and flyers are distributed. Outside buyers are not granted entrance through the gates until 9 a.m., and residents are asked to postpone their shopping until 9 a.m. in consideration of sellers setting up for the sale. The semi-annual garage sales have become enormously popular with almost half the residents either buying or selling. Some villages also use the event for fundraising. Popular spring sales are tools, furniture, linens and other household items. Trilogy garage sales have become well known and attract people from surrounding areas. Club Hours – The Delta Club is open at 7 a.m. for entry with members' keys. It is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. for entry without keys and from 5 p.m. until 11 p.m. for entry with keys. From 11 p.m. until 7 a.m., there is no entry. The Vista Club is open from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Thank You – The Administrative Office appreciates and thanks all members who abide by the Rules and Regulations of the community.

Your Pets, Your Responsibility – If your pet leaves waste anywhere in the community including your own yard, you must clean it up as soon as possible. Please be considerate of your neighbors and have pride in your community by carrying bags with you when you walk your pets or by using the bags provided in dispensers throughout the community to pick up after your pets. To do otherwise is a violation of the Rules and Regulations. In addition, all pets must be on a leash and under control of the owner at all times.

You Might Be Missing Important Information, Electronic Notices – You are encouraged to give your email address to the Administrative Office, if you haven't already. More and more information is being disseminated through email blasts rather than tubing.

Late Charges on Assessments – If you are paying your assessments through your bank, it is recommended that you move the date of payment to the first of the month when the assessments are due. Many banks are batching payments before sending them out, so even though your account may show a payment on a particular date, the payments are not being mailed on that date. If you choose to schedule payments through your bank or mail your check after the first of the month, you are choosing to take the risk of being charged a late payment.

Parking in front of mailboxes – Parking in front of mailboxes is prohibited. Please inform your service providers not to park there either. It makes it difficult for others to retrieve their mail and also makes it difficult for staff to put flyers in the tubes.

Irrigation – Please adjust your sprinkler system to reflect weather conditions.

Welcome Center Notification: Reminder – It is your responsibility to call the Welcome Center or email them when you are expecting guests and especially when you are having a party and expecting several guests. If the Welcome Center is not notified, it is possible that your guests will be denied access to the community.

Anonymous Notes to the Administrative Office/HOA – The Administrative Office does not take any action on notes that are dropped into the HOA Box in the Delta Club hall, slid under the door, mailed and/or submitted on an Administrative Communication Form that are not signed.

Updating Your Information at the Administrative Office – It is important to let the Administrative Office know when any of your information changes including moving from one property to another within the community. (Please include address, phone, email, frequent guests, emergency contacts, etc).

Suspicious Behavior – Trilogy is a private community but not a secured one. If you observe unusual behavior that warrants a call to the police, please do so.

Dumping Trash – Putting trash anywhere in the community other than your own garbage is prohibited. This includes the dumpsters at the Delta and Vista, construction sites, empty lots and in garbage cans at the parks. Every resident is required to have garbage service. Do not put soda cans, water bottles and other trash in the doggie waste disposal receptacles under the doggie bag holders throughout the community.

Service Provider Resource at the Delta Club – There are two business card holders on the hall wall at the Delta Club. When looking for service providers, check out this area. TRVMA/HOA does not recommend any of these vendors; this is simply a resource for members.

Pets in the Clubs – Pets are prohibited in both the Delta and Vista Clubs with the exception of service dogs. Service dogs are allowed only if they have been registered with the Administrative Office and have a TRVMA identification card. They must have their vest and TRVMA card on them at all times when they are in the clubs and they must be accompanied by the person for whom they are providing a service. If you do not comply with a request from a staff member to show them the TRVMA card, you will be required to leave the club until you present it. Therapy dogs are not allowed in the clubs at any time. They are not service dogs and are not protected under the ADA.

Animals – Feeding of any domestic or wild animals outdoors is prohibited. The wild animal situation can only be controlled with the help of all members.

It's Your Money – Please help cut down on avoidable expenses by:

- 1. Putting down umbrellas at the bocce courts, the Delta back patio, and especially the Delta pool area when you are leaving and no one else is around. When the wind catches the umbrellas they are often damaged and must be replaced. If they are on the glass tables in the outdoor pool area, not only are they damaged but the glass table tops are shattered. This costs time of the maintenance staff who must assure that all glass is cleaned up and also the expense of replacing the table tops. The table tops and umbrellas are quite expensive.
- 2. Keep the plants alive! Refrain from pouring anything in the plant pots throughout the clubs. These plants are expensive to replace.
- 3. Several items are missing from the clubs including phones (these phones cannot be used anywhere else so it is pointless to take them) and café glasses, cups, paper towels, toilet paper etc. Please report any theft to the Administrative Office/HOA. Remember that when anyone takes something, all members pay for the replacement. We need your help in cutting down on theft.

Gardeners - Please remind your gardeners that they cannot start work before 8 a.m. and that they must bag all clippings rather than blowing them into the street, gutters and other's yards.

Architectural Applications, Important reminder - Applications must be submitted for work being done on the exterior of your home and yard. If you do not submit an application, a \$500 application fee can be charged.

Delta and Vista Pool – Family Swim Times: The Delta pool heater will remain off until May 1. The pool is still open if you are a polar bear swimmer. The Delta hot tub is heated all year. Children under the age of 18 are allowed in the pools during the hours of 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. Children must be out of the pool area by 3:15 p.m. You must accompany all guests to the pools regardless of their age.

RV/Boat Passes – You must enter through the front gate with your recreational vehicle and obtain a pass. Reminder: you may not have these vehicles in the community longer than 48 hours and they cannot be occupied while in the community. They must be parked at your home, not in any common or undeveloped areas of the community.

Golf Carts – Remember golf carts must:

- A. Yield to overtaking vehicular traffic
- B. Be operated by a person with who is at least 18 years old
- C. Be covered with sufficient liability insurance

Golf carts must obey all traffic signs that other vehicles must adhere to, including following the directional arrows in parking lots.

For Your Safety – If you walk in the street, please yield to vehicles. Often there are groups three or four people deep that make it difficult for vehicles to pass. Please wear light colors and carry a flashlight when walking or biking at night or early mornings.

Adult Committee

The Adult Committee met on Feb. 23. No actions were recommended to the Master Board. The committee meets the last Thursday of every month in the Delta Club at 1 p.m. All residents are encouraged to participate in these meetings. Your suggestions, comments and/or questions can be given to any committee member, left at the HOA office, or voiced during the resident input segment of each meeting. Applications for a possible four-committee vacancy that will be effective May 1, 2012, were accepted through March 15. Applications to fill unexpected vacancies are accepted at any time. Village Riviera Board News

The Riviera Board continues to deal with the feeding of wild animals. No animals should be fed outside the home with the exception of hanging bird feeders. Bird seed placed on the ground is a violation. Speaking of pets, please remember that you are only allowed two domestic pets in your home. If you choose to take them outdoors, they must be on a leash.

Electronic delivery of the Master Board agenda is saving money for all of us. If people will opt-in to receive their Master Board budget, we will be saving money, trees, and the list goes on. There is no known downside to the electronic delivery. When you are asked to opt-in to this, please accept. If you do not have email, you will still receive these items by regular mail.

The Master Board has approved the hiring of another person at the HOA Office who will be dedicated solely to working with our Architectural Review Committees (ARC) for all villages. In order to obtain a permit for work from the City of Rio Vista, you must have ARC approval first. The city made this decision to help avoid further issues.

The board voted to increase our village dues to \$4.50, which was required by the Master Board. An attorney opinion obtained regarding this increase, since it was more than the 20 percent of the regular assessment allowed per year (currently \$3.50), indicated this was acceptable under the conditions noted in the attorney opinion. This change will take place with the June1, 2012 payment.

The topic of surveys was brought up by Barb Downs. Driveway parking would be a question, but anything could be included in the survey. The board took a let's-wait-and-discuss-this-further approach, and hopes that folks in the village who would like a survey will come to the meetings and discuss the issue. A survey, if done at all, would not be binding to the board, just informational.



Keeping Raccoons Out Of the Attic

During the mating/breeding season, avoid utilizing deterrents to keep raccoons out of your house. These will kill offspring that may already be in the attic, for example, and would prevent the mother from returning to the nest. Deterrents can be put into action during the off season.

Activity or noises at dusk or early in the morning around dawn may be an indication that you have boarders. Begin looking for entry and exit points. Do not seal off an area as long as you know there are occupants inside. You can try sprinkling flour along the entry/exit points to capture tracks. The best way to determine if the animal/offspring are still occupying the vicinity is to conduct a visual check using a bright light if it is in a darkened area.

Another method to ensure that the raccoons have left is to loosely stuff newspaper into the openings during the morning or afternoon when the raccoon(s) may be asleep inside. If the newspaper was not moved after a couple days, it is safe to proceed with repairs and to close off the raccoon's access points.

Since raccoons like warm, dark, quiet places, deterrents can assist in making sure they have moved on and may be helpful before you seal off an area. Since raccoons are night foragers, employ these methods at night, after they have left the den for the evening. Deterrents include:


- lighting the area with a flood lamp
- playing a radio
- putting mothballs, ammonia soaked rags or sprinkled cayenne pepper in their sleeping area
- using a motion detector that emits a really loud noise when an animal comes near**

**Pet supply stores and the Internet have motion detectors of this type. You may try a "Scraminal." It is so loud the raccoons might find it offensive.

Finally, be patient. Raccoons are highly adaptive, so try a few different combinations of these deterrents if at first you don't succeed.




