The last regular monthly meeting of the Master Association Board was held on June 14, 2011 in the Diablo Room at the Vista Club. The meeting was attended by more members than usual. It also lasted longer than usual, as several items on the agenda sparked substantial discussion.

Actions taken at the meeting included:

- Passage of the consent calendar which included:
 - a request from the Disaster Preparedness Committee to purchase related items, in the amount of \$1,593.02 from Operations.
 - a request to hold the Rio Vista Senior Summit here on October 14, 2011.
 - a bid from Sun N Stuff for the purchase of Delta Club patio furniture in the amount of \$12,132.58 from Capital Improvements.
 - the purchase of a John Deere Gator, from Stockton John Deere, in the amount of \$7,941.77 from Capital Improvements.
- Approved an expenditure, in the amount of \$2,900 from Operations, to conduct an Engineered Traffic Study and awarded the contract to KD Anderson and Associates.
- A motion to approve a proposed resolution, which would authorize the Rio Vista Police Department to patrol and enforce the California Vehicle Code <u>failed</u> to pass with a two to two vote.
- Approve an expenditure in the amount of \$772.50 from Operations, to pay for half of the \$1,535 installation cost of picture failing to facilitate the Art Guild for Artists, who will pay the other half, making the Monterey Room into a "gallery" and awarded the contract to Spradling Construction.

FREE Shredding Service – The shredding truck will be in the parking lot near the tennis courts on **July 16 between the hours of 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.** The shredding will take place on-site. This service is provided through Rio Vista Sanitation but will be done by Shred It. The service is on a first come – first serve basis. Once the truck is full, no more materials will be accepted, so come early.

Anonymous Notes to the Administrative Office/HOA – No action is taken on notes that are dropped in the HOA Box in the Delta Club hall, slid under the door, mailed and/or submitted on an Administrative Communication Form that are not signed.

Suspicious Behavior – The community is a private one but not a secured one. If you observe unusual behavior that warrants a call to the police, please do so.

Dog Waste – Please pick up after your pooches. Trilogy is being notified that many members are not doing this and some are picking it up, putting it in bags and then leaving the bags on empty lots. This seems to be a particular problem on the undeveloped lots, especially along Sunset Landing.

RV/Boat Passes – You must enter through the front gate with your recreational vehicle and obtain a pass. Reminder: you may not have these vehicles in the community longer than 48 hours.

Golf Carts – Complaints continue regarding of children driving golf carts. Remember golf carts *must*:

- A. Yield to overtaking vehicular traffic
- B. Be operated by a person with a valid driver's license or at least 18 years old
- C. Be covered under sufficient liability insurance coverage

Trash Cans – Many cans are being left out of the garage without being behind enclosures. This is a violation of the Rules and Regulations for the community.

Animals – Please do not feed any animals outdoors. Reports of members feeding pets and wild animals outside continue to be made. Support from all members is crucial for controlling the situation.

For Your Safety – If you are walking in the street, please yield to vehicles. Often times there are groups of three to four people deep, making it impossible for vehicles to pass. Please wear light colors and carry a flashlight when walking or biking at night or early mornings.

Visitors to the Vista Club

If you have guests, please remember the following rules apply to your guests using the Vista Club:

<u>Billiard Room:</u> a resident must be with their guests when they use the Billiard room. All guests must be at least 18.

Cyber Café: all guests may use the Cyber Café.

<u>Cyber Café computers:</u> available for residents and their guests over the age of 10. Guests between the ages of 10 and 18 must be accompanied by a member. There are no parental controls on these computers.

Power Outage Procedure

In the event of a power outage:

- No one will be admitted to the Vista Club.
- If the power is still out after 15 minutes, the Vista Club will be cleared and closed.
- If the power comes on before 6 p.m., staff will reopen the Vista Club.
- If the power comes on after 6 p.m., the Vista Club will remain closed until the next morning.

Another problem discussed was the changing of surnames or using variant forms of the original surname. We should remember that many of our ancestors were illiterate and relied upon the census taker or the immigration agent to spell the name correctly. The Soundex system was established by the National Archives to index the U.S. censuses beginning around 1880 to help with this problem. It codes together surnames of the same and similar sounds but of variant spellings. We encourage you to join us for our next meeting and come prepared with as much information as you can collect. Rhoda usually has pedigree charts for you as well as a few suggestions on where to start and some free websites to try.

Our genealogy workshop was a great success with lots of helpful information exchanged. We extend a special thank you to Patricia Robinson for bringing in her family tree. It hangs in her home and covers eight feet by three feet. We were so pleased to see what she and her sister had accomplished through lots of work and we were surprised to see the extensive details when she rolled it out. 
