

Executive Session

- A. Committee Appointments The Board placed in nomination names for the Access, Administrative Policies, Adult and Document Revision committees. Appointments for the Amenities and House Renovation committees were postponed as charters are being revised. Appointments will be made at the time each charter is approved.
- **B. Dormant Village Board Appointments** The Board appointments for Saddle Rock and Eagle Point were tabled until the next meeting.
- C. Operations Review: Club Reservations due to the increased number of clubs and Association activities, the Board is reviewing the procedures for club reservations. No decisions were made at this time.
- **D. Web Page RFP Review** a draft RFP for an Association Web Site was reviewed, with the agreement the RFP will be ready for final review next month.

General Session:

Unfinished Business:

A. Janitorial

- 1. In-House Services Review (\$119,738.00): Even though the Board had budgeted for the proposal of bringing the Janitorial service in-house, the procedure of a formal discussion and approval had not been done. At the request of the Board, Action Property Management Director of Hospitality for Action performed an analysis which recommended 124 hours a week, with the understanding the Day Porters will provide 3 hours/day of light janitorial. Approval of bringing Janitorial services in-house was approved: (4-1)
- 2. Equipment Purchase (\$9,219.55): approved an expenditure of \$11,000 from the budgeted 2016/17 Capital Improvements fund to purchase equipment necessary to bring Janitorial Services in-house. (4-1)

New Business:

- A. Committee Appointments: The Board approved the proposed nominations for the following committees: Access, Administrative Policies, Adult, Document Revision committees. (see page 13 for listings) Appointments for the Amenities and House Renovation committees were postponed as charters are being revised. Appointments will be made at the time each charter is approved. (Unanimous)
- **B. Reserve Expenditures:** The House Renovation Committee presented items for consideration. Both were tabled, as additional information was requested from the Board, and more bids will be requested.
 - **1. Window Coverings (Delta \$12,210)** proposal to replace the wood blinds throughout in the Delta Club
 - 1. Carpets (Vista \$11,693.73) proposal to replace the carpet in the Sonoma, Monterey rooms and the Learning Center in the Vista Club.



Coupons will reflect the monthly assessment for those receiving them. Those on automatic withdrawal (ACH) may check their bank statements after the 5th of the month to see the amount taken out and all members may register at www. actionlife.com to monitor their accounts 24/7. If you have questions or need help registering online, please call the Administrative Office 707-374-4843.

New Administrative Office/HOA hours Effective May 1: Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Association Minutes and Financial Statements – Minutes of the Master Board Meetings, Village Board Meetings, Committee Meetings, and Financial Statements, are posted on www.MyTrilogyLife.com (MTL) and www. vivoportal.com (VIVO) for your review.

Credit Cards – Credit cards are accepted at the Café, and Member Services for events, fitness cards, personal training, and spa services, etc. They are accepted at the Administrative Office/HOA for payment of transponders, keys and payment plans. They cannot be used to pay monthly assessments at the Administrative Office but you can pay monthly assessments on VIVO with credit cards.

Club Hours – The Delta Club is open from 7 a.m. - 11 p.m. From 11 p.m. - 7 a.m., there is no entry. The Delta Club pool, spa and patio are open 24 hours daily. The Vista Club is open from 6 a.m. - 9 p.m.

Late Charges on Assessments – Assessments are due on the first of each month. Many members treat the 15th as the due date and then request a waiver of the late fee when payment is not received by the 15th. If paying assessments through a bank or mailing a check, it is recommended that date of payment be moved to the 23rd of the month so that the payment is actually received by the first when the assessments are due. Many banks are batching payments before sending them out, so even though your account may show a payment on a particular date, the payments are not being mailed on that date. In addition, the post office has closed facilities and laid off employees. This is resulting in longer times for mail to reach its destination. If payments are scheduled through a bank or mail without adequate time allowed for delivery, there is a risk of being charged a late payment.

Street Lights – Report all street lights which are out to the Administrative Office/HOA. Please have the light pole number, street name and the nearest cross street. Due to the high expense of hiring the boom truck, service is called once there are 10 lights needing repair. This could mean several weeks between the time you report the light and the actual repair.

RV/Boat Passes – Taking an RV to the Welcome Center each time you need a pass is unnecessary. If an RV has been registered on Dwelling Live, a resident can simply go to the gate and pick up the pass. You can now get a 24-or-48 hour pass for RVs/Boats. Be sure to let the Welcome Center attendant know which pass you need. Reminder. you may not have these vehicles in the community longer than 48 hours and they cannot be occupied while in the community. They are to be parked at your home, not in any other common or undeveloped areas of the community.

Electronic Communication – The Association is no different than other organizations in leaning more on electronic communications to its members. There are two ways you can assist in reducing costs to the Master and Village Associations. Thank you for considering both of the following options.

 e-Alerts – Submit your email address to the Member Services desk at the Vista Club. This will get you information such as special announcements, monthly agendas and most importantly, the weekly e-Newsletter, which updates you as to activities in Trilogy and the greater Rio Vista area.



Disclosure Opt-in –Required documents such as budgets and yearly financial statements, can be delivered electronically by signing a form authorizing delivery by electronic methods, available at the Administrative Office.

You have signed up for e-Alerts and Disclosure Opt-in but are not receiving them? - If you stop receiving the MTL e-Newsletters and/or the TRVMA e-Alerts, please contact Jacquie at jroche@actionlife.com or stop by the Member Services Desk. We'll then work with the email team to make sure that you're on the 'active' list in the email system. It is also suggested that you add the e-Newsletter email address – noreply@actionlife.com - to your "safe senders" or "friends" list in your email settings to reduce the odds of problems.

Gardeners – Please remind gardeners that they cannot start work before 8 a.m. and that they should bag all clippings/leaves and not blow them into the street, gutters and others' yards.

Violations – Please do not register complaints to the Administrative Office/HOA without making sure you have the correct address of the alleged violator. Example of what not to report – two houses down from the corner of a particular street. If you receive a violation notice, please contact the HOA office.

Your Pets – Your Responsibility – We appreciate everyone who is being considerate of your neighbors and showing pride in your community by carrying bags with you when you walk your pets or by using the bags provided in dispensers throughout the community to pick up after your pets. The Vista and Delta Clubs' swimming pool and spa are reserved for the exclusive use of Residents and their invited guests within Trilogy at Rio Vista. Please observe these rules.

- 1. All visitors <u>must be accompanied by a Resident</u> at all times while at the pool.
- 2. Pool hours will be posted at the pool. Sign in upon arrival at the Delta Club pool during family swim time which is 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. (for guests under the age of 18).
- 3. There is NO LIFEGUARD on duty. Residents and guests use the facility at their own risk.
- 4. Please Shower before entering the pool or spa.
- 5. No diving or jumping from the edge of the pool is allowed.
- 6. Please keep gates and doors to the Delta pool and facilities locked at all times.
- 7. Swim suits are required. No cut-offs or other street clothing is allowed in the pools or spas.
- 8. Diapers are not allowed in the pools or spas. Any person who is incontinent is not allowed in the pools and spas.
- 9. Persons with skin infections, open wounds or a communicable disease may not enter the pool or spa. No adhesive bandages are allowed in the pool or spa.
- 10. Long hair must be gathered in a ponytail or worn under a bathing cap.
- 11. Children who are unable to swim must be supervised by an adult who will remain within arm's reach at all times the child is in or near the water.
- 12. Due to safety and health reasons, children under the age of 14 are not allowed in the spa.
- 13. For your safety and the safety of others, **NO GLASS CONTAINERS** of any kind are permitted in the pool area.
- 14. Cooking is permitted in the Delta Club's barbecue area only.
- 15. Boisterous, rowdy, or inappropriate behavior is not allowed in the pool area.
- 16. NO PETS are allowed in the pool or pool area at any time, with the exception of a certified "service" dog.
- 17. Protect poolside furniture from suntan oils and body lotions by covering with a towel before sitting down.
- 18. Flotation devices and other items may only be used in such a way that they do not interfere with other pool users.
- 19. Smoking is prohibited in the pool areas.

In order to preserve the safety of all those who enjoy the pool facilities, the Master Association of Trilogy reserves the right to refuse access to any person creating a nuisance or who pose a danger to themselves or others. Please be responsible in all pool activities.

became a "right-to-dry" state. Pursuant to California Civil Code 4750.10, the following Guidelines and Rules apply:

Clotheslines/drying racks must be:

- 1. Manufactured specifically for that use;
- 2. Removable and no taller than 6 feet;
- 3. If single-line, retractable and be attached to patio cover supports;
- 4. Neutral in color;
- 5. Independent of any fence, tree or any other part of a structure other than a patio cover support (i.e. gazebo, shed, etc.);
- 6. Limited to back yards and must not extend beyond the sides of the house;
- 7. Abide by established five foot setback from back property line;
- 8. Used only during daylight hours and removed from view after use;
- 9. Removed permanently if the apparatus falls into disrepair.

The 2nd Reading for adoption will be at the May 5 meeting, where changes may be made. If you have comments or want to discuss a change, please join us.
