Our May Master Board meeting was very well attended – standing room only! If you weren't there, you can view the video recording on mytrilogylife.com. Information on those issues that may be greatest interest to the members is in the Highlights section below. Details of all other agenda items are included under Executive Session and General Session.

Highlights

- We have a new Board member. Jim Wichmann was appointed to the position recently vacated and will serve through the Annual Meeting in February, 2018.
- Shea Homes/RVCP has agreed to increase their contribution to a fourth clubhouse from \$1 million to \$1.3 million.
- A Request For Proposal (RFP) to convert to LED streetlights will be submitted in May.
- Information about the Board's actions pertaining to the proposed sale of the golf course was reviewed. Three consultants, who are golf property appraisers, will be invited to submit proposals for evaluating the golf course and restaurant. We hope to have their proposals by the June 13 Board meeting. Executive Session May 8:

Legal/Litigation

- An Establishment License for Esthetician Services was issued on April 28, 2017 by the California Department of Consumer Affairs, Board of Barbering and Cosmetology. Inspection is expected within 90 days of issuance.
- The stop sign at Silver Ridge and Birch Ridge will be placed after distribution of this *Trilogy Living* and announced at a Saddle Rock Village Board meeting.
- Per a legal opinion requested by the Board, the Board is allowed to approve expenditures from the Development Fund (Article 3.8 of the CC&Rs); it does not require a vote by Delegates or the membership. The same legal opinion was unclear regarding loan approval; the Board requested legal counsel attend the next Executive Session to clarify.
- The City Manager requested that TRVMA require those who do business with us to obtain a City of Rio Vista Business License. The GM will so notify those businesses that qualify under the City Code. The Board declined the suggestion that acquiring a Business License be part of our architectural process. The Board is not willing to police this requirement on behalf of the City.
- The Maintenance Director will work with Don Seyk, liaison to the Amenities Committee, on the final specs for the Health and Wellness Center.
- Berding & Weil, legal counsel, completed a review of all TRVMA (continued on p. 16)

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From the Editor

My office cubicle is just a few feet away from the Vista Club lobby, which means I get to hear a steady staccato of conversation and laughter from residents as they enter and leave the

building. Most of the time, the sounds drown out the piped-in music that filters through the building's sound system. And on rare occasions, like a recent day in May, a measure of musical magic fills the air and something special happens.

The special event was the Coffee House Players, hosted by the Guitar Club. It featured a half dozen musicians who played 30-minute sets to the delight of a small gathering of residents who happened into the Vista Club living room area that day. Believe me, there was an amazing array of talent as each performer serenaded listeners with spot-on renditions of familiar songs or created their own arrangements to make the songs their own.

Created about five years ago, the Guitar Club has only about 15 active participants, but virtually every member is an accomplished musician who enjoys jamming with club members and performing in front of audiences. Their music ranges from folk and country, to contemporary, rock, pop and standards from nearly every musical discipline. Hawaiian ukulele players? Irish tenors? Classical guitarists? The club has it all. Some of the members have performed professionally, including Denny James (the theatrical name for Trilogy resident Denny Rogers), who has recorded two albums.

The primary showcase for their notable talents are the This 'n That Coffee House performances – about eight per year – which combine musical selections with poetry readings. Past concerts have drawn as many as 140 attendees, who rave about the professionalism of their guitar-strumming neighbors. The next coffee house, which features a dozen or more musical sets, is Sunday, June 25, in the Diablo Ballroom at the Vista Club. Read more about the Guitar Club on page 35.



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

Don't Forget Your Resident Orientation!

All residents are required to attend an orientation and complete paperwork that is kept on file in the administrative office. Orientations are offered at 3:30 p.m. every Wednesday at the Delta Club. Topics include:

• Using the welcome gate program to authorize and/or restrict visitors and vendors. Once a guest or vendor has been entered, a call to the Welcome Center is unnecessary. Any computer, tablet or smart phone can be used to access one of the programs listed below. Set up email or text notification to be notified when a guest is checked in at the Welcome Center. Add driving directions to your residence for your guest's convenience.

• Setting up your homeowner account on VIVO to pay your monthly assessment. It can also be used to access your homeowner account information, your eStatement, a map of Trilogy, the CC&Rs, an Architectural Application, and any work orders/issues, with which you have requested assistance from the Homeowners Association.

- Understanding the architectural approval process and information unique to your village. Receive a Village Homeowner Handbook and Architectural Application. Submit an Architectural Application for any work being done on the exterior of your home and yard. If approval is not obtained a \$500 application fee can be charged.
- Obtaining a second transponder, amenities key, and/or parking permit window sticker authorizing your vehicle to park in your driveway.
- Receiving critical information and answering your questions on how to make the most of Trilogy Living!

Updating your information is also required!

It is important to let the administrative office know when moving from one property to another within the community or anytime there is a change in your information. Your property file holds vital information needed in an emergency and required by the federal government.

Emergency Action Committee

Mosquito infestations will be more widespread this year, raising concerns about West Nile virus and Zika. Last month, we told you about ways to reduce mosquito infestations by removing standing water around your homes. Even a small amount of water in a flower pot or irrigation drain can become a breeding ground for mosquitoes.

This month, we provide tips for reducing the risk of mosquito bites. According to the California Dept. of Public Health, mosquitoes that spread West Nile virus are most active in the early morning and early evening hours. If you go out during those times, wear long pants and a long-sleeve shirt. Use an EPA-registered insect repellant with DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon. Put the repellant on all skin areas not covered by clothes. Follow the directions carefully. Finally, fix or replace torn door and window screens to keep mosquitoes out of your home. Offer to help neighbors fix their screens. You can find more helpful tips on the California Department of Public Health website, www.westnile.ca.gov or by calling the Solano County Mosquito Abatement Program at 707-437-1116.

The Emergency Action Committee is an all-volunteer group of Trilogy residents under the direction of the TRVMA Master Board. We need volunteers who live in Trilogy and care about their neighbors. property. A letter was sent to Shea Homes/RVCP, LLC requesting transfer of deeds on all property now deeded to them and a formal walkthrough and inspection of common area parcels deeded from RVCP to TRVMA.

Formation of Contracts

- The Board will meet with the architect, Allen Schafer, in Executive Session to review the overall requirements of the Delta Club Design/Build project.
- The consultant hired to develop an RFP for management services, Karen Conlon of Sequoia Grove Consulting, has held interviews with key staff and surveyed Board members. The Board will meet in Executive Session with Ms. Conlon to review the data obtained and receive a draft of the RFP.

Personnel

- Joel Auslen was appointed to serve as the Master Board member on the Eagle Point Village Board of Directors.
- Don Seyk was appointed to serve as a member of the Negotiating Team.
- The Board reviewed the following: progress on an operations audit that Action Property Management conducted; additional hours required for bocce court maintenance; Member Services staffing and hours; and improvements to the member complaint process, aka Communication Form.

General Session May 9:

- The Board accepted the donation of two Joola table tennis tables that were purchased by the Table Tennis Club.
- An expenditure of \$1,600 from reserves to purchase two Joola table tennis tables was approved. All four tables will have a reserve life of 10 years.
- •The Board approved an expenditure from reserves of \$1,600 to stripe courts 3 and 4 with lines for Pickleball. The work will be done by Saviano Co., Inc.
- An expenditure. not to exceed \$4,600 from the Access Upgrade fund, was approved to build a wireless "tunnel"/intranet for communication of transponder code to gates and award the con-

tract to Internet Planet.

- The Board voted to accept the proposal from A&D Automatic Gate for upgrades to our access control system. The cost, incorporating DwellingLive, is not to exceed \$25,000 and will be funded by the Access Upgrade fund.
- The new website, mytrv.org, will include a Privacy Policy and Terms of Use agreement provided by Association Voice. The Board approved having legal counsel review these documents to ensure the interests of TRVMA are covered. The Web Evaluation Team and the Communications Coordinator will review all data elements that will be on the site and identify those which will require log in. The information will be presented to the board for approval.
- •The outdoor pool season will be extended through the end of October. Information regarding the frequency of use and weather conditions will be collected to determine whether usage justifies the additional expense of heating and pool maintenance (approximately \$3,000).
- A recommendation was made by the Community Advisory Committee to establish a permanent lap lane in the deepest part of the Vista Club pool. The Board did not make a motion. Therefore, the recommendation will not be adopted.
- The final design of the Dog Park provided by Shea was reviewed. This design indicates a smaller area than desired for small dogs. The Board approved the overall design stipulating that the area for small dogs will be no less than 4,500 square feet. Further, the board requested that the agreement received from Shea Homes be reworded to clarify that the Dog Park is a project of Shea Homes for which the Board is contributing an amount not to exceed \$58,003. The GM was asked to attend the Rio Vista Planning Commission meeting held May 10, 2017 where the disposition of a Conditional Use Permit for the Dog Park was discussed.

JUDY LEWELLEN An Inspiration to All



At age 40, Judy Lewellen began noticing some changes in her health. Most of all, she was tripping frequently for no reason. At first, doctors suspected Multiple Sclerosis, but after extensive research and a battery of tests, they diagnosed Judy with Charcot-Marie-Tooth Disease (CMT), a rare, hereditary condition that damages nerves in the arms and legs. In Judy's case, the disease affects only her legs, causing her to use a cane at first and now a walker. Although she has lived with CMT for 33 years, she doesn't let it control her life.

"I will have this disease for the rest of my life," Judy says, "but it's not fatal because I developed it later in life. I've learned to live with it, and I certainly don't want people to feel sorry for me. I'm in control of my life, not CMT."

You may have seen Judy pedaling around Trilogy on her 3-wheel bicycle, which she rides daily, or participating in Advanced Aqua classes in the Vista or Delta pools. She says the classes have helped her balance, allowing her to advance from the Vista pool ramp to the Delta pool steps, all on her own. She moves around with the help of a walker because the disease forces her to drag her legs as she walks. But just try keeping up with her!

"Several years ago, a friend of mine introduced me to living a healthier lifestyle, including yoga, Chinese herbs, practicing breathing techniques, and taking natural substances to improve my immune system," Judy says. "I also make a point of wearing colorful tops that focus attention to my upper body, not my disability. That's just who I am."

Judy moved to Trilogy at Rio Vista about a year ago from Big Oak Flat, a small town some 25 miles from the Yosemite entrance, where she lived for 35 years. Her husband, Gary, had died recently, but her daughter in Walnut Creek and her son in Sonora are nearby in Northern California. She has always lived an active life and has been a self-motivator, owning a variety of businesses from a convenience store and gas station to a gift shop and restaurant. She's no stranger to hard work, so Charcot-Marie-Tooth Disease is no match for her.

"Some day I hope to buy a remote-controlled scooter that folds and I can put it in my car easily so I can go visit my family and friends," Judy says. "Until then, you'll still see me on my walker or bicycle. I've never been one to sit around, and I'm not about to start now."







It's all too easy to make mistakes in your genealogy. You want your research to be professional in quality. It will make it easier for you to use and add to it, and be a better family heirloom and resource for future generations.

Here are some mistakes and tips on how to avoid them. 1) Record your sources as you go. If you don't know where

you got it, you won't be able to use it to prove a genealogical theory or use it alongside other evidence. 2) Organize your genealogy research. Use binders and plastic sleeves to eliminate the confusion of finding what you need when you need it. 3) Copy information from online family trees. Just because someone posts a family tree online doesn't mean the information is correct. Be sure to double-check its accuracy. Research their research. 4) Relying on your family's oral history. While most family history stories have a grain of truth to them, details get changed, either on purpose by someone wanting to conceal potential embarrassing information or by accident, such as someone hearing or remembering the details wrong or an attempt to make the story more interesting. Always research the facts behind family history stories before recording them on your official family tree.


