From the Master Association

The Trilogy Rio Vista Master Association Board of Directors meeting was held in the Diablo Ballroom of the Vista Club on Tuesday, March 12, 2013.

A Special Executive Meeting was held Feb. 19 and the following actions were taken:

• The Golf Course Committee discussed various options regarding the course. Also discussed were, financing, appraisal, course management companies and "due diligence."

The following actions were taken resulting from Executive Committee sessions:

- Tom Moore was voted to serve as Vice President of the Board.
- The Board voted to allow any property owner in Trilogy to apply for the open Master Board seat. Application must be made by April 5. Interviews will be conducted by the four board members on April 8. Voting by the Master Board will be at the Executive Session on April 9., with the seat being filled at the April 9 evening Master Board Meeting.
- Legal documentation pertaining to the Golf Course was discussed.

The following actions were taken resulting from the Master Association meeting:

- Mayor Norman Richardson was present to discuss the idea of a transfer of the Lighting and Landscape District to our H.O.A. Much has to be done prior to anything happening and a timeline of perhaps two years was mentioned.
- The City of Rio Vista will be using the Rio Vista Room in the Delta Club on April 27 for Goal Setting meeting. The public is invited. The hours will be 12 – 4 p.m.
- Golf Course acquisition was discussed. The Board agreed to enter into a "Letter of Intent" with the seller and will make a "good faith" deposit of \$10,000 with a local title company. These funds are refundable if we are unable to reach an agreement on the purchase price.
- The Board agreed to select CourseCo as the management company, if we ever do purchase the golf course. CourseCo will lead a "due diligence" inspection of the golf course, equipment, buildings and kitchen area. We have agreed to pay CourseCo a fee of \$12,500 if we do not purchase the course.
- The Amenities Committee asked the Board to indicate interest in using no more than \$35,000 in Development Funds to improve Rutland Park. The Board showed no interest in the project.
- Approved \$70,000 for refurbishing the median strip from the main gate to Marks Rd. Lawn will be removed and drought tolerant plants will be placed. This will result in a water cost savings and reduce the deterioration of the roadbed due to current over spray by the current sprinklers.

The next Master Meeting is April 9, 2013 at 7 p.m. in the Vista Club.

Trilogy Community Garage Sale

Saturday, May 4, 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.

As they say, one man's trash is another's treasure. Be a part of the Community Garage Sale! Everyone can participate! Sellers, help buyers find your sale. Simply phone Member Services (4200) **prior to April 27** to provide your address so we can highlight your block on the community map. The map will be emailed to residents by May 3. It will be made available to visiting buyers at the Welcome Center the day of the sale. Copies will also be available at the Vista Club Saturday only. You do not have to be included on the map to sell. There are three points all sellers must follow:

- Obtain a garage sale permit for \$1 from the City of Rio Vista, downtown at City Hall prior to Friday, May 3. This is a city requirement. City Hall is closed all Fridays and weekends.
- 2. Tie an inflated balloon from your mailbox or tree.
- 3. Open your garage door.

When you finish selling, remove the balloon and close your garage door. The sale is open to the public, advertised in the local papers, and flyers are distributed. Outside buyers will not be allowed through the gates until 9 a.m., and residents are asked to postpone their shopping until 9 a.m. in consideration of sellers setting up for the sale. The semi-annual garage sales have become enormously popular with almost half the residents either buying or selling. Some villages also use the event for fundraising. 
Village Riviera






Bocce Club



Monthly tip: Is it really OK to eat cheese if it's moldy? It depends on the type of cheese. You should toss moldy soft or fresh cheese such as goat, feta or cottage cheese. These have high moisture content and can harbor mold throughout, even if you see it only on the surface. You should also toss packages of shredded or sliced cheese if you find any mold. But if you spot mold on firmer cheeses such as cheddar, Swiss or parmesan, you can salvage the block. Just cut off the moldy area at least one inch around and below the surface. And make sure to wash your knife between cuts to avoid transferring the mold from one part of the cheese to another.
