#### President's Report, July 14, 2015

#### **Master Board Executive Session**

- Contract for the landscaping of the Welcome Center Entryway and Hwy 12 was discussed. The Board is considering what the ongoing contractual obligations will be for the old LLD and who will be doing the work. A proposal by Valley Crest was submitted and tabled until additional information has been investigated.
- There was an initial discussion on the process for upcoming Management Contract renewal.
- The Board reviewed and updated all of the Liens and Collection statues of delinquent accounts. Our outspending balance continues to improve.

#### **Master Board General Meeting**

- Melissa Coleman was appointed as Access Committee
   Liaison
- The 2014-15 Audit was approved
- Committee reports of note indicated that the Document Revision Committee will meet on July 21 with the attorney, to be followed with a meeting of the committee, attorney, and the Master Board; date to be announced.
- California Vehicle Code: The Master Board conducted a discussion and voted to affirm the previous Board resolution to ask the City to approve the CVC upon the roadways of Trilogy.
- A discussion was held on the 2nd reading of the Wildlife Pest Management Policy before it was voted on. A lengthy discussion ensued and the policy was approved without major changes.
- Bocce Court Renovation was approved at a cost of \$28,558.40, against budgeted reserves of \$53,345, to be done in conjunction with the installation of the new courts. The work is expected to be performed in the first part of August.
- A presentation of the impending roadwork to be done this summer was made and approved at a cost of \$115,084.69, against a budgeted reserve of \$141,004.





# **Emergency Action Committee**

Fourteen members attended, committing to attend future CERT meetings. To better understand the CERT program, one of our members attended the June 30 CERT Conference in Richmond.

What is CERT? The Whittier Narrows earthquake in 1987 underscored the area-wide threat of a disaster in California. This event confirmed the need for training civilians to meet their local immediate needs. Therefore, the Los Angeles Fire Department, which in 1985 came up with the CERT concept, created the Disaster Preparedness Division with the purpose of training citizens as CERT program volunteers.

The CERT program goes hand-in-hand with the scope of our committee; our members are honored to collaborate with the RVFD and the Rio Vista Police Department in developing a CERT program for our city.





# Summer Smart

By Dr. Kimberly Gilmore

Summer means more outdoor activities. Here are a few reminders for staying healthy this summer.

Healthy Hydration: Drink

plenty of water throughout the day. Aim for approximately 64 ounces (6-8 glasses) of water a day. Drinking caffeinated or alcoholic beverages does not help with hydration, so use care and only drink these in moderation. Consider a chilled herbal tea (naturally caffeine-free) or lemon water as an alternative to sugar-loaded drinks. As a refreshing treat, put seedless chilled watermelon in the blender for a naturally sweet drink.

**Seasonal Snacks:** Fruits and vegetables can provide refreshing and healthy snacks. Choose produce that are in season for the freshest options and, often, the best prices. Northern California summer fruits and vegetables include apples, artichokes, asparagus, avocados, blueberries, blackberries, figs, melons, nectarines, peaches, pears, plums, raspberries, and tomatoes. Coincidentally, many of these foods are high in antioxidants. For example, anthocyanidins in berries or lycopene in tomatoes help protect our skin from the sun, so eat plenty of nutrient dense fruits and vegetables for summer health.

**Party Prepared:** Consider bringing a healthful dish like a vegetable salad, crudités and hummus dip, or a quinoa salad for your next barbecue or picnic. Have a healthy snack before you go or eat some fruits and vegetables as appetizers. Also, apples or a handful of nuts make great snacks and are particularly helpful in curbing the appetite.



Sun Safety: Use sunscreen to avoid sunburns while outdoors. Sunscreen choices include the mineral or chemical types. The best choices are mineral with zinc and titanium oxide at the top of the list. Zinc oxide is the best option. Use this resource for choosing a sunscreen: http:// www.ewg.org/2015sunscreen/. As a general rule, don't spend any more time in the sun than you normally would without sunscreen. Most importantly, avoid sunburns as research shows that when skin gets damaged, it increases the risk for skin cancer and accelerates skin aging. Wear lightweight, light-colored long sleeve clothing and a wide-brimmed hat to help protect your skin from the sun. Remember to protect your eyes with sunglasses as blocking UVA and UVB rays may reduce risks of cataracts and age-related macular degeneration. Hats can also help protect your eyes from the sun.

Battling ants around your house this summer? A few helpful tips include keeping counters and shelves clean and washing dirty dishes. Wash surfaces with soapy water or use a vinegar/water solution. Keep tempting foods like sugar and honey in water bowls or zip-closing bags. Ants send out scouts, so if you see a few, try to find the opening, wash it with diluted vinegar to hide their scent trail, and fill in the crack with caulking in a thin line. Bay leaves, diatomaceous earth, real white chalk, petroleum jelly, cayenne or red chili pepper, turmeric and cinnamon are distasteful to ants so spread at the entrance you found. Arriving ants can be sprayed with Windex or soapy water to kill them, not leaving a harsh residue for your pets and you. Keep all food in tightly closed containers or the refrigerator.
