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

Issues before the Board

LLD/WWTP

At the time of this writing the transfer agreement has been approved by both the city and the Master Board and is awaiting the final vote of the delegates. Upon approval, the process will be put into action with an expected effective date of April 1, 2015. The City will dissolve the LLD. Going forward, there will not be a fee on your property taxes and instead it will be included in your monthly dues. You are presently being charge close to \$107, which converts to \$8.91 per month and your charge on your dues will not exceed that number. The budget process shows actual maintenance cost will be below \$6 per month and the money we will be getting from the city will cover our reserve contribution. The City charged a \$50,000 administrative fee that we will not have to charge. This is a win-win situation. Members will pay for the LLD either way, so it boils down to who can manage the maintenance and the costs the best. We can.

Upon final approval we will take over the WWTP and transfer our maintenance department there. We have \$79,000 already set aside and collected for remediation and remodeling so there will be no additional costs for that action in the budget of your monthly dues.

Budget:

We are in full swing with the budget and it should be finalized by February 10.

Upcoming Issues

At our next Board meeting the Access Committee will present the results of the survey and their recommendations.

We are taking action to request the city enforcement the California Vehicle Code inside Trilogy.


Olympic Village Residents' Club



Free tax help is available not only for those ages 60 or older, or for those in financial need, but also for people of different ages with moderate incomes. This tax assistance service will be available February 9 through April 6, 2015.

Tax-Aide is a program of the AARP Foundation offered in conjunction with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and the California Franchise Tax Board. The program provides free, nationwide tax counseling services with the mission to provide high quality income tax assistance and tax form preparation. AARP Foundation Tax-Aide volunteers are trained in cooperation with the IRS to offer help with personal income tax returns and to electronically file their federal and state returns.

At a face-to-face discussion, Tax-Aide volunteers assist the taxpayers in completing an Interview/Intake Sheet. Working with that information, last year's tax returns and current tax year information, they complete both federal and California tax returns. After the taxpayer(s) has reviewed the returns and another counselor has "quality reviewed" them, the returns are e-filed, which ensures accuracy and a faster refund.



Changes to Master Association Rules and Regulations

At its January 14, 2015 meeting, the Trilogy at Rio Vista Master Association (TRVMA) Board of Directors approved a 1st Reading of additions/changes/amendments to the Trilogy at Rio Vista Master Association Rules and Regulations. A 2nd Reading for final adoption will be on the March 10, 2015 agenda which you are welcome to attend and make comment.

The following is an addition (#6) to the General Rules and Regulations:

The intent of this new rule is to give protection to pedestrians who are forced to give way to overtaking/oncoming bicyclists, skateboarders, etc. The width of the community's sidewalks/walkways prohibit multiple users with different needs.

Riding bicycles and skateboards and operating scooters, golf carts or other similar methods of transportation/recreation, are prohibited on walkways/sidewalks within the community. This regulation does not apply to motorized vehicles used for disabilities.

Changes to Village Rules and Regulations

At their January, 2015 meetings, each Village Board of Directors approved a 1st Reading of additions/changes/amendments to the Trilogy at Rio Vista Village Association Rules and Regulations. A 2nd Reading for final adoption will be on the March, 2015 agendas, which you are welcome to attend and make comment.

The following is an addition (#6b) to the General Regulations:

The intent of this new rule is to give freedom for political expression as provided in California Civil Code, yet give reasonable time-frames and number of political signs to be placed on private property.

Political signs campaigning for a specific candidate or measure may not be placed in a yard more than sixty (60) days prior to an election and be removed within one week following the election. Each property is limited to one (1) sign per candidate or measure and must follow state law in that they may not be more than 9 square feet in size.
