



Executive Session

The Executive Session of the Master Board was held on May 13

- Warrior Golf Director of Operations, Trevor Tam, reviewed his obligation and intent to the community as it related to the Golf Course CC&Rs and Restaurant operation
- The Board was updated on the status of the LLD and WWTP negotiations for presentation to the General Membership at the Master Board Meeting later in the day.

Master Board Meeting of the Board of Directors

Regarding the Document Revision Committee report, this committee is charged with rewriting the CC&Rs for the HOA. There are three comments to their task:

- One is to update the documents to conform to the new or changed regulation from the state on issues governing HOA organizations
- Two, updating each of the Villages' documents as well and;
- Three, review and improve the voting method by which we elect Board Members.

The committee is constituted by having as members each of the Delegates and two members at-large, all of which will serve until the process is complete no matter how long it takes. The committee chairman is former Board President Bob Sather and the meetings are guided by legal counsel. The committee will present a draft to the Board and eventually the results of their work will be provided to the membership for discussion. The finished document will go to the entire community for a vote as outlined by law.

An update on the WWTP/LLD was presented and the Board

- Authorized up to \$5,000 for the final testing on the WWTP site.
- There are still some remaining issues on the LLD including the results of a reserve study the Board had commissioned. That study is presently underway and we expect the results shortly.
- Water usage and budget reviews of the LLD are still not yet finished.

The Board approved the installation of a new shade structure over the Vista patio, at a budgeted cost of \$60,000. Assuming normal time frames apply, we expect the project to be finished by August.





Riviera Board News

The Riviera HOA board would like to thank all those who attended our meeting on May 1 and let us know how they felt about allowing residents to park in their driveway without obtaining a parking permit. This will be an ongoing topic at our meetings as only Riviera and Village I require parking permits. Opinions were diverse. Some residents said that they moved to Riviera because of the uncluttered feel of the village, while others felt that it is their home and they should be allowed to park in their driveway without having to obtain a permit. Currently you may park in your driveway during the day. If you park in your driveway after 10 p.m. without a permit, a parking violation will be placed on your vehicle. In order to obtain a parking permit you need to make an appointment with the HOA office to come to your home and measure your garage to insure that your vehicle does not fit. Measurements are taken from the garage door to the wall as if the garage was completely empty. If you have three vehicles registered to you and your home only has a two-car garage you are granted a permit. Residents are not to park their cars on the street overnight.





Wildlife Management Subcommittee

In Time of Drought

From California Department of Fish and Wildlife 2012 report:

"Drought conditions negatively impact habitat through resource deterioration and wildfire causing migration and behavioral changes of animals. Wildlife becomes concentrated in remaining suitable habitat."

What does this mean for us? Animals may come closer to homes where water and food can be found. What can we do? Be tolerant of any animals you see moving around the community. Do not interfere or do anything to encourage animals to come into your yard. Place your trashcans out in the morning instead of at night. Adjust sprinklers to avoid overwatering.

The best kindness we can show to wildlife is to allow animals to remain wild. If animals become accustomed to people, they become dependent on humans for food and water. When they come into close contact with humans, it is usually bad for the animal.

If you are interested in promoting a healthy wildlife population, please work with your elected officials at all levels for habitat conservation. Source: Contra Costa Times, May 5, 2014.







Doggy Tips:

If you walk your dog at night, stay safe by being more visible: Wear reflective clothing and outfit your dog with a leash and collar made of reflective material. If your dog spends time outside in areas where ticks like to hang out, a tick check should be part of your daily routine. Even the best repellents may not prevent these parasites from latching onto your pooch. And since it can take 24 to 48 hours for an attached tick to transmit an infection to its host, it's important to promptly and properly remove these parasites. First, run your fingers slowly over your dog's entire body. If you feel a bump or swollen area, check to see if a tick has burrowed there. Don't limit your search to your dog's torso: check between his toes, under his armpits, the insides of his ears, and around his face and chin.




