Executive Session: The Executive Session was held on 10/10/16 in the Monterey Room. Items acted upon in the General Session are reported under that session.

Legal/Litigation

- Amenities Negotiations/MOU: the Board discussed points to be negotiated and set objectives.
- Beer & Wine License: continue to gather information and feasibility of the Association obtaining a Beer and Wine license.

Personnel

- Staffing:
 - Levels Administration: Management reported on current staffing levels and concerns regarding the need for additional staff hours. Due to the increased number of new homeowners and work needed to be completed, the Board has acknowledged the Administrative Payroll budget line item will be over budget and approved additional 20 hours a week for a new temporary employee to perform Inspections.

 Minimum Wage Impacts: discussion regarding available options to address and budget for the increased requirements. This has been continued to another meeting.
- Reservation Process Ratification: the Board continues to work with staff and the Production Clubs to define scheduling. Permanente days and times have been allocated for Rehearsals and length of stage setup. All Productions will be held in the Vista Club due to possible remodel of the Delta Club.
- **Library Operation:** directed Management to work with the library support group to formalize as a Club.

• Landscape Maintenance Contract Review: the current Landscape contract was reviewed and discussion of current level of maintenance. The scope of work will be reviewed, updated, and prepared to send out for bids.

- 2017 Write-Offs \$10,856: yearly action on Uncollectable debts on issues such as bankruptcies/foreclosures.

Minutes and Financial Statements - Minutes of the Master Board Meetings, Village Board Meetings, Committee Meetings, and Financial Statements are posted on My Trilogy Life (MTL) - Mytrilogylife.com and VIVO - vivoportal.com.

Club Hours

- Delta Club interior is open from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- Delta Club pool, spa and patio are open 24 hours daily.
- Vista Club is open from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Credit Cards – Accepted at:

- Café Vista & Member Services for food, events, fitness cards, personal training, spa services, etc.
- Administrative Office/HOA for transponders, keys and payment plans.
 Cards cannot be used to pay monthly assessments but may be paid on VIVO with credit cards.

Mail Theft -

- Members are encouraged to place outgoing mail in the mail box in front of the Delta Club. Mail in a mail box with a raised flag makes it very easy for thieves to know which mailboxes to target.
- When away for a couple of days or longer, be sure to put a stop on mail delivery with the post office.
- If unusual activity near mailboxes is witnessed, call the Rio Vista police immediately. If a vehicle is involved, try to get a license plate number. Once the individual(s) leave, there isn't much that can be done.
- Check with the post office regarding locking inserts that can be put inside your current mailbox. Try to be at home when having parcels delivered to your front door.

Parking in Front of Mailboxes – Thank you for helping your mail carrier and TRV staff, and giving neighbors easy access to their mailboxes by not parking in front of them and also asking service providers to park elsewhere.

Street Lights – Report all street lights which are not working to the Administrative Office/HOA with the light pole number, street name and the nearest cross street. Due to high expense of callouts, when 10 lights need repair, service is called. This could mean several weeks between the time you report the light and the actual repair.

RV/Boat Passes – Taking an RV to the Welcome Center each time you need a pass is unnecessary. If an RV has been registered on Dwelling Live, a resident can simply go to the gate and pick up the pass. Reminder: an RV may be parked no longer than 48 hours and they cannot be occupied while in the community. They are to be parked on your street, not in any other Common Area or undeveloped areas of the community.

NEW – You can now get a 24 or 48 hour pass for RVs/Boats. Be sure to let the Welcome Center attendant know which pass you need.

Electronic Communication – The Association is no different than other organizations in leaning more towards electronic communications to its members. Thanks for considering both of the following options:

eNotices – Submit your email address to the Member Services desk at the Vista Club. This will get you information such as special announcements, monthly agendas on eAlerts and most important, the weekly eNewsletter, which updates you as to activities in Trilogy and the greater Rio Vista area.

Disclosure Opt-in – To reduce costs, required documents can be delivered electronically by signing an authorization form at the Administrative Office.

Have you signed up for eNotices and Disclosure Opt-in but are not receiving them?

If you stop receiving the MTL e-Newsletters and/or the TRVMA e-Alerts, please contact Jacquie at jroche@action-life.com or at the Member Service Desk and she will work with the email team to make sure that you're on the "active" list in the email system. It is also suggested that you add the eNewsletter email address – noreply@actionlife. com - to your "safe senders" or "friends" list in your email settings to reduce the odds of problems.

Indoor Plants – Please do not use the potted plants as garbage receptacles or water plants. Staff takes care of the plants and when well-meaning members decide to help, it often makes matters worse. The plants are expensive to replace and all members pay for replacements.

Anonymous Communication – Only signed communication forms will be accepted and can be submitted to the Administrative Office

Violations – Please do not register complaints to the Administrative Office/HOA without making sure you have the correct address of the alleged violator. Example of what not to report – two houses down from the corner of a particular street.

If you receive a violation notice, please contact the HOA office.

Your Pets – Your Responsibility – Thank you to those who are considerate of neighbors by keeping their pets on a leash at all times and carrying bags when pets are exercised or by using the bags provided in dispensers throughout the community to pick up after your pets. Only take 1-2 bags at a time, not enough for the life expectancy of your dog.

Pets in the Clubs – Pets are prohibited in both the Delta and Vista Clubs, with the exception of service dogs. Service dogs are allowed only if they have been registered with the Administrative Office and have a TRVMA identification card. They must have their vest and TRVMA card on them at all times when they are in the clubs and they must be accompanied by the person for whom they are providing a service. If you do not comply with a request from a staff member to show them the TRVMA card, you will be required to leave the club until you present it. Therapy dogs are not allowed in the clubs at any time. They are not service dogs and are not protected under the ADA.

Updating Information at the Administrative Office – It is important to let the Administrative Office know when any personal information changes including moving from one property to another within the community. (Please include address, phone, email, frequent guests, emergency contacts, etc.)

Late Charges on Assessments – Assessments are due on the first of each month. Many members treat the fifteenth as the due date and then request a waiver of the late fee when payment is not received by the fifteenth. If paying assessments through a bank or mailing a check, it is recommended that date of payment be moved to the twenty-third of the month so that the payment is actually received by the first when the assessments are due. Many banks are batching payments before sending them out, so even though your account may show a payment on a particular date, the payments are not being mailed on that date. In addition, the post office has closed facilities and laid off employees. This is resulting in longer times for mail to reach its destination. If payments are scheduled through a bank or mail without adequate time allowed for delivery, there is a risk of being charged a late payment.

Welcome Center/Dwelling Live – Please make sure that your guests and vendors have your full name and/or address to give the Welcome Center attendants: otherwise, they will not be given access. The Welcome Center attendants are grateful to those members who enter guests on Dwelling Live, call the Welcome Center or email them when you are expecting guests and especially when you are having a party and expecting several guests. They don't want to deny access to anyone you are expecting, but have no choice if they haven't been notified and

they can't reach you to get your authorization upon your guests' arrival. Instructions for using Dwelling Live are available at the Vista and Delta Clubs.

Dumping Trash – Thank you for using private receptacles for disposing of trash rather than any others throughout the community, and for not putting soda cans, water bottles and other trash in the doggie waste disposal receptacles. By city ordinance, all properties are required to have garbage service.

It's Your Money -

- Thanks to all members who put down umbrellas at the bocce courts, the Delta back patio, and especially the Delta pool area when you are leaving and no one else is around. When the wind catches the umbrellas they are often damaged and must be replaced. If they are on the glass tables in the outdoor pool area, not only are they damaged but the glass table tops are shattered. This costs time of the maintenance staff who must assure that all glass is cleaned up and also the expense of replacing the table tops. The table tops and umbrellas are quite expensive. Again, thank you for saving all members the cost of replacing them.
- Please report any theft to the Administrative Office/ HOA. Remember that when something is stolen, all members pay for the replacement. The Association needs help from all residents in cutting down on theft.

Gardeners – Please remind gardeners that they cannot start work before 8 a.m. and that they should bag all clippings/leaves and not blow them into the street, gutters and others' yards.

Architectural Applications – Applications must be submitted for improvements to the exterior of your home and yard. If you do not submit an application, a \$500 late

would be printed to paper or delivered on an USB drive. Approval of the majority was to be USB drive. For those of you who have not Opted In to received documents electronically, you will be able to obtain a printed copy at the Administration Office.

Opt-In Campaign: Director Kohn designed the Opt-In Campaign to reach out to as many Members as possible to encourage those that wanted to, to sign up to receive their documents electronically. Opt-ing In saves the association money and is environmentally sensitive. From the campaign, 223 Members signed up. All Members who have Opt-In were eligible for three \$25 gift cards, which were awarded.







The Civil War: On April 16, 1862, The Confederacy passed the Conscription Act, the first effective general military draft in America. This Act, initially drafted healthy white men ages 18 to 35 for three-year terms. The federal government instituted its own draft a year later. This Enrollment Act called on men ages 20 to 45 to register for the draft. As in the South, substitutes were allowed, or else men could pay a \$300 commutation fee. Conscription was partially meant to encourage voluntary enlistment, as those who joined as volunteers were eligible to receive bounty money from states, counties, cities, and the federal government. To find your Civil War soldiers, try the Soldiers and Sailors Database provided and maintained by the National Park Service. To find land given as payment for service and possibly a note about their Military Unit, try Glorecords.blm.gov. These are both free search sites.






