





On foreclosure homes, we (the village) will pay to have the lawn and bushes cut, but have chosen not to have the water turned on because we also have to pay the sewer fee. Sometimes adjoining neighbors will water a brown lawn. It is amazing how fast it again turns green. But, we are all paying more for water, so this is only what some have done. Please report these homes to the HOA Office so we can have the grass cut short, bushes trimmed, and weeds pulled until we can get the bank owner to turn the water on and take care of the property.

# Raccoons in the House

During this time of year, mother raccoons take their young out to forage, so your kitchen may look inviting. What can you do?

First, make sure you don't leave any food for your own animals outdoors. Their favorite food is cat food. When you bring it inside, keep it in a place where the raccoons can't see it. If they think that food is easily available they may try to get in. Second, if they do get in, sometimes animals may not be able to leave the way they came in, so you may have to let them come through the house to find another exit. When this happens, open the windows and doors, leave the area and wait quietly for the animals to leave.

It is important to remain calm so that they don't panic and cause damage to the surroundings. Animals are sensitive and pick up on energy. Don't be aggressive toward the raccoons. If the mother is out and about with her young she will be more defensive than usual to protect her offspring from harm. Stay out of their way as much as possible. Third, shutting off the lights may help calm them. Make sure pets and children are kept out of the area as well. You can put out a treat for the raccoon(s) near the exit to lure it/them outside.

This is the last of the series on raccoons. Hopefully you found the information helpful in dealing with our masked bandits.

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



Monthly tip: Nothing brightens a bite of a summertime muffin quite like the burst of a fresh-baked blueberry, unless you discover the poor things have sunk to the bottom, where they have congregated into a mush. The cause of sinking is in a sense the season itself. In the heart of the summer, fat, ripe berries may be denser than batter, causing them to drop. A dash of flour will help blueberries defy gravity for the very simple reason that the flour makes them stick to the batter and stay put. Just toss blueberries with a tablespoon of flour before folding in. But use flour from the recipe—don't add extra; that will keep your ingredient ratios even. As always, be gentle when mixing the muffin batter. Overbeaten batters can thin out, exacerbating the problem and producing a poor crumb as well. If your batter seems a bit thin, try sprinkling some of the berries on top just before baking.


