

From the Master Association

Don Love President

Executive Session

The Board authorized \$1,500 to get a legal opinion from a Water Rights attorney as to our rights to the Golf Course water as recommended by our Association attorney. We may wish to expand our rights agreement with the Golf Course for other usages in order to reduce dependence and cost on Rio Vista potable water for landscaping purposes.

The Board agreed to make the House Renovation committee a standing committee rather than an ad hoc committee and have them report directly to the Master Board.

The General Manager gave an update on information about the possibility of changing the lighting in the street lights to LED with a projected return on investment of less than two years. Projected saving would be in excess of \$60,000 to \$70,000 per year. Further study will be conducted to confirm the reliability of the estimate.

It was agreed to go to bid for the work on the Summerset Medium landscaping. The estimated \$90,000 for this project is in this year's budget but was delayed due to the drought.

Master Board Meeting

The Board agreed to go to bid for 10 new computers and rolling desks in the computer room. There are ample funds in Reserve to pay for this upgrade. The computers will be All-in-One desk tops. Rolling tables will allow for different configurations of the room in case it is needed for other meeting purposes.

Two special requests were approved.

A Garden Club event with speaker was approved open to the public. No costs were involved.

At the request of the Mayor a consulting firm hired by the county will be allowed to set up two tables in the Vista Foyer in the morning of Nov 17th to ask Trilogy residents what they would like to see in upgrading the Delta Breeze bus service. The county is seeking a grant to upgrade the service. Please click on their info in the What's New at Trilogy notice and take their electronic survey.

Two Committee Charters were reviewed and approved. The Trilogy Amenities charter and the Emergency Action Committee was expanded from five to nine members. Nominations were reopened for the Emergency Action Committee and will remain open for 30 more days.

The Board gave a first reading on a new fine of \$250 for the dumping of rock/sand on roads. The homeowner is responsibility for the fine for any violation and the fine statement will be on all Landscaping application forms.

The Basic Three

Which supplements should I take? What types of supplements and does it matter? How much should I take? How long should I take it? Many people are curious about nutritional and dietary supplements, and I get these ques-



tions frequently. In addition to a whole foods diet with a variety of foods and plenty of fruits and vegetables, I generally recommend a probiotic, an omega-3, and a multivitamin. There are others that I may recommend on an individual basis but these basic three can be helpful for

most people. Of course, it is always best to check with your family physician or naturopathic doctor before adding any supplements or medications to ensure no drug interactions and specific dosages for your unique circumstance.

PROBIOTIC

Probiotics are the "friendly" or "good" bacteria that live in our gut. We need healthy gut flora for a strong immune system, to metabolize certain foods and make nutrients, and to prevent growth of "bad" bacteria. Examples of "good" bacteria are *lactobacillus* and *bifidobacterium*, which along with 400 plus other species make up some of our healthy gut flora. These "good" bacteria can be found in some fermented foods although not all commercial products provide quality organisms. According to the American Academy of Microbiology "the quality of probiotics available to consumers in food products around the world is unreliable." For this reason, it can be helpful to supplement the diet.

Type: I recommend a high quality probiotic from a repu-

table company. This is important because some studies have shown contamination or a lack of the correct ingredients in some products.

Dose: I recommend taking one capsule daily for one to three months, now and again, for general health. Probiotics can be especially useful for those who have taken antibiotics. Look for at least a billion Colony Forming Units (CFU). Probiotics can be taken safely for 6 to 15 months.

Caution: Individuals with a compromised immune system should not take probiotics without speaking to their doctor first.

OMEGA-3 FATTY ACID

Omega-3 fatty acids help decrease inflammation in the body, help lower triglycerides, and are important for nerve function. They have been shown to protect against dementia, depression, inflammatory disorders, skin conditions, attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), allergies, and cardiovascular conditions. Omega-3 fatty acids can be found in a concentrated form in fish oil supplements. Omega-3 sources for vegans or vegetarians include flax seed oil and algae supplements.

Type: I strongly recommend a high quality fish oil supplement as the potential for contamination with Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs) and mercury is of concern. There are several brands that test each and every batch for these contaminants to ensure a quality product. Additionally, some of my patients who have used high quality brands have been pleasantly surprised and reported reduced "repeating" or tasting the fish oil from burping. Fish oil can be taken as gel caps or in liquid form. Higher concentrations can be more easily achieved with the liquid form.

Dose: For omega-3s, it will depend on whether you eat fish and how much and often, but in general about 1



gram a day of combined eicosapentaenoic acid (EPA) and docosahexaenoic acid (DHA) is recommended. Read the label for the correct dosing.

Caution: Because fish oil can make our blood less 'sticky,' it is recommended you speak to your doctor if you are taking blood thinners (warfarin, aspirin, heparin, etc.) to evaluate your unique circumstance.

MULTIVITAMIN

Multivitamins must be absorbable to offer any nutritional benefit. The form of the vitamin or mineral is also important as this impacts bioavailability. Generally, I recommend taking a high quality multivitamin since our soil has become depleted and it is more difficult to get all of our nutrients from foods even when consuming a whole foods, nutrient-rich diet.

Type: A high quality multivitamin so you can trust that the research has been done to determine the best forms at the optimal doses. I generally recommend a capsule, rather than a compressed tablet, as they tend to be more absorbable.

Dose: The recommended dose on the label can often be cut in half since many multivitamins have a daily dose that requires 4-6 capsules. Again, it depends on each individual and the specific needs.

Caution: Certain ingredients such as iron or copper are needed in small amounts, but most of us get these from

our diet and too much of these metals can be toxic and increase oxidation.

A NOTE ON SUPPLEMENT SOURCES

Not all supplements are created equally. There are guidelines called Good Manufacturing Practice (GMP) that some companies follow to help ensure their products are consistent and high quality. The problem is that it is not well regulated by the FDA, so consumers cannot be sure that all products follow GMP. As a naturopathic doctor, I rely on reputable supplement companies so I can trust the ingredients to achieve the desired results. I rely on independent third party certification programs (like NSF) and distributors that only sell these superior items. This helps confirm potency, efficacy, and quality. More importantly, it helps ensure safety as many herbs and raw ingredients can have contamination or toxicity.

Members of Rio Vista can have access to reputable distributors that screen companies and products to ensure the best products. These supplements may cost a little bit more but your health is worth it! Wouldn't you feel better consuming a product when you know that each batch has been tested for contaminants, pesticides, and bacteria? It is reassuring to know that the product you are buying is what the label says it is. This cannot be assumed for all nutritional supplements being sold at large discount stores or online. Please contact Dr. Gilmore to learn more about these high quality supplements.





Separate dry and moist cookies, and those with clashing flavors. No biscotti with oatmeal cookies, or peppermint with gingerbread. (3) Keep most cookies in an airtight tub or tin at room temperature. Hard, crisp cookies can be stored between layers of waxed paper in a loosely covered cookie jar. (4) Arrange cookies in single layers in the tin, separated by parchment or waxed paper. (5) Revive stale cookies by heating them on a baking sheet in a 275 degree oven for 10 minutes. This even softens biscotti enough that they won't break your teeth, but the bad news is that the cookies tend to revert when they are cold again.






