

Executive Session: Approved minutes for the April 12th and April 26th meetings

Residential Care Facility – obtained additional information regarding rights of the Association and the use rights of the tenants. No issue was presented, just informational only.

Verification of Association Property – as Shea nears completion of the Trilogy project and the Board moves forward with plans for future improvements to common area. I requested the Board approve obtaining legal assistance to; 1) Review and provide a title report for all property that should at this time be in Trilogy's name. (ie All Common Areas, Streets and the open spaces known as the Drill Sites); 2) Provide recommendation on the method to get everything properly deeded 3) Request the attorney to contact Marks-McCormack to acquire information on the method to go forward on obtaining their authorization to install any improvements on their property; 4) Advise the Association on the steps to identify the current Gas Well Operators per the Accommodation Agreement and assist with the steps necessary to consider improvements to the drill site set back areas.

Access to Environmental Services Center - approved requesting legal to contact Marks-McCormack for obtaining a Right to Access Easement from Airport Rd to the backside of the Environmental Services Center (ESC).

Amenities Committee Charter – there was much discussion about the expectation and responsibilities of the committee. At this time, the current committees 'Trilogy Amenities Committee' and 'Long-Range Amenities Committee' are still active under their current charters. No changes at this time but future review will be considered

Operations Review – Club Reservations Process - after meeting with staff and the club representatives the Board approved additional guidelines to be used when approving reservations.

General Session:

Unfinished Business:

- The Sub-Boards of Dormant Villages Saddle Rock and Eagle Point were appointed
- Access Improvements approval to create an RFP for Lift Gates, RFID System and QR Guest Passes. This was approval for an RFP ONLY. There will be more discussion and review with the community before the final decision is made.

New Business:

• Dog Park – the Board acknowledged Shea's intent on what is planned to be installed and that what is currently being discussed may not include all items the Dog Club would like to see. Management has been directed to work with Shea to finalize the plan, and bring back to the Board those items than may need to be funded by the Association.







The Village Riviera Board would like to thank all those that attended our meeting on May 5. Even though the presidents of the various HOA boards have no authority over common interest areas, Don Seyk, Riviera's president, urged our Master Association to support the following actions:

- Commit to the building of a clubhouse.
- Charter the Amenities committee to determine amenities that would go into the clubhouse. Funding to come from the Development Funds for necessary internal items.
- Take action in a timely fashion so we do not lose the capital available to us from the developer prior to their departure.

A commitment by the Master Association to the facility will start the building design process and cost analysis done by Shea. The current estimated budget is \$1,000,000 for a building to consist of a shell, bathrooms, and utilities. If the Master Association fails to act it would be a loss to our community of \$1,000,000 and we would have only landscaping on the site. Any future construction would be done at the expense of the residents. With an additional 400 homes currently estimated to be completed by 2018 and possibly as many as 1,000 new residents, we must act quickly because our current clubhouses are already stressed.
