Master Association Notes ROBERT SATHER President

When the holidays haven't quite arrived and its already time to do the Master Association Notes for the next month it seems strange to say: "I hope you had a wonderful holiday season and a great time at the Polar Bear Plunge."

The regular monthly Master Association board meeting was held in the Diablo Room at the Vista Club on December 14, 2010. This was one of our evening meetings and the board thanks all who attended. There were around forty in attendance.

Actions taken at the meeting included:

- Passed a motion to approve entering into a 3-year management agreement, as allowed in Section 3.3.1(f) of the bylaws, with Action Community Management, stipulating year-to-year terms with a 90-day termination clause.
- Approved an expenditure, in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 from Capital Improvements, for the renovation of the Welcome Center, and awarded the contract to Spradling Construction.
- Approved an expenditure, in the amount of \$1,266 from Capital Improvements, for the purchase of a portable bar from Atlanta Fixture and Sales Company.
- Referred a request from the Table Tennis Club, for the purchase of a new table tennis table, to the budget committee for consideration for the new year budget.
- Approved an expenditure, not to exceed \$4,000 from Capital Improvements, for a wood/glass windbreak at the Delta Club to be installed by the maintenance department.
- Referred a proposed Master Amenities Committee Charter back to administration for possible separation into two committees.
- Approved February 8, 2011 as the Annual Meeting date and January 28, 2011 as the Developer Date of Record and Candidate Declaration Deadline. Appointed Gene Vick as the Inspector of Election.

The next regular meeting of the Master Association Board is on January 11, 2011 in the Diablo Room at the Vista Club at 2 p.m. There is a Vision meeting on January 20, 2011 in the Diablo Room at the Vista Club at 1 p.m. (please note the change of location for the Vision meeting). We look forward to your attendance at our meetings. Your input is always appreciated. See you soon.

VILLAGE RIVIERA BOARD NEWS







BASIC DISASTER SUPPLIES KIT

by Trilogy Disaster Preparedness Committee

The following items are recommended for inclusion in your basic disaster supplies kit (for more information, contact Lynne at LYNNEH10@aol.com):

- Three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Extra clothing
- Three-day supply of water one gallon of water per person, per day
- Kitchen accessories and cooking utensils, including a can opener
- Portable, battery-powered radio or television and extra batteries
- Photocopies of credit and identification cards
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Cash and coins
- First aid kit and manual
- Special needs items, such as prescription medications, eye glasses, contact lens solutions, and hearing aid batteries.
- Sanitation and hygiene items (moist towelettes and toilet paper)
- Winter attire: jacket or coat, long pants, long sleeve shirt, sturdy shoes, hat, mittens, and scarf
- Matches and waterproof container
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket (per person)
- Whistle

Remember: The items in your emergency kit should meet your seasonal needs. In the winter you must think of warmth. It is possible that you will not have heat. Think about your clothing and bedding supplies. Be sure to include one complete change of clothing and shoes per person.

Maintaining Your Disaster Supplies Kit

Just as important as putting your supplies together is maintaining them so they are safe to use when needed. Here are some tips to keep your supplies ready and in good condition:

- Keep canned foods in a dry place where the temperature is cool.
- Store boxed food in tightly closed plastic or metal containers to protect from pests and to extend its shelf life.
- Throw out any canned good that becomes swollen, dented, or corroded.
- Use foods before they go bad, and replace them with fresh supplies.
- Place new items at the back of the storage area and older ones in the front.

- Change stored food and water supplies every six months. Be sure to write the date you store it on all containers.
- Re-think your needs every year and update your kit as your family's needs change.
- Keep items in airtight plastic bags and put your entire disaster supplies kit in one or two easy-to-carry containers, such as an unused trashcan, camping backpack, or duffel bag.
